**HOW THE PHILIPPINES BECAME CATHOLIC.** When the Spaniards arrived in the Philippines in 1521, more than 100 ethnolinguistic groups already occupied the archipelago of more than 7,000 islands. While they did not exist as one country, the islands were nevertheless connected to each other via trade routes and slave-raiding that included other territories in the region. Trade, in fact, existed before the 10th century. The islands also teemed with religious diversity. The Ifugao in northern Luzon, the Tagalog in southern Luzon, the Visayan in the central islands, and the various indigenous communities in Mindanao each had their own cosmology, code of ethics, and mode of worship. Muslim communities were also scattered around the islands, including Manila. **DYC 2021** has been postponed, as announced by the Office of Evangelization in Richmond Diocese: “Many people have been asking about DYC 2021. As you are aware, we were hoping to hold this in February on a somewhat local level. Parishes would provide the opportunity for kids to gather together or to even pull in multiple parishes from the surrounding area. However, with the continual increase in COVID cases and the Governor’s Executive Order limiting groups to 10 people, at this point we have made the decision to postpone DYC. We know teens don’t want to spend a minute more on Zoom than they have to, so we will be looking to hold DYC when it can be almost entirely in person and safe at a parish or regional level. The Office for Evangelization is looking into ways we can provide programming for the near future, and have a couple of exciting things in the pipeline to support you and your teens. I’m sorry that DYC is being moved, but look forward to a time when we can hold this event again.”
