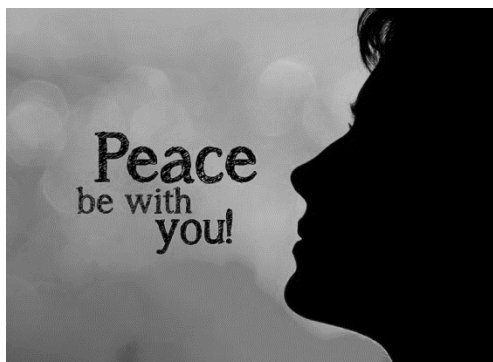

DEAR ST. JOHNS, this is a follow-up to my mission visit with you on the weekend of May 13-14, 2017 from the Spirit of the Mountains Cluster in Southern Virginia. The cluster received \$4,437.61 that was divided among our three parishes according to percentages established several years ago for cluster expenses and receipts. Good Shepherd in Lebanon VA used \$1686.29 to pay the invoices received from the Diocese, car insurance, and the cost of checks. St. Therese in St. Paul VA used \$1,641.92 to pay invoices from the Diocese and vehicle insurance. St. Mary in Coeburn VA used \$1,109.40 to pay the balance of their heat pump installation/thermostat/receptacles replacement project. St. Mary's received a \$5,000 Diocesan Home Mission grant for the \$6,525 project; therefore, their share of the funds from St. John the Evangelist was much appreciated. The cluster parishioners and I cannot begin to tell you how grateful we are for your parish's donations. These funds have allowed the churches to meet budget needs without touching funds set aside for emergency situations. Thank you once again. God bless—*Rev. Zaverio Banasula, Pastor*
