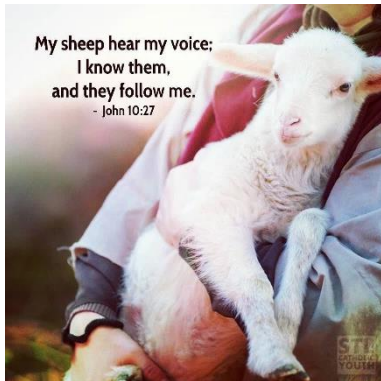

Please Help Feed the Hungry in Haiti!

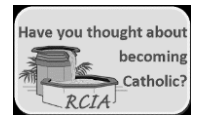

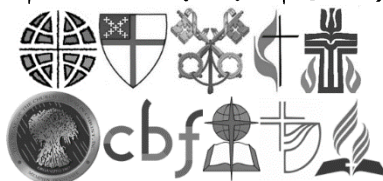
