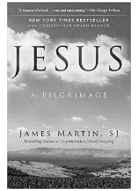
**THE FEAST OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST/JUNE 24.** This day, also known as Midsummer's Eve, commemorates the date of the martyrdom of St. John the Baptist. It is also a celebration of the summer solstice. The feast of St. John the Baptist has always been a favorite in all of Latin America, the Philippines, Spain, Mexico, and Hispanic United States. Puerto Ricans make a particular festive celebration of this date because San Juan is the patron of the namesake capital city of the island. Early in the morning, wherever possible, people go to beaches and rivers to welcome the day with the ablutions of St. John. During the day, in many places, people have fun "baptizing" passersby in the streets. This is in accord with the proverb which says, "En el día de San Juan, toda aguas es Jordan." (On the day of St. John, all water is Jordan water"). It is also customary on that day to welcome summer luminarias and bonfires. Have fun today with the family—baptizing each other! Squirt guns, garden hoses, spray bottles, water balloons all work quite well!

**BREAKING OPEN THE WORD.** God does not take a vacation from speaking to us and being present to us in His Word. Nor do we take a break from being nourished by God's Word. Join us Sunday mornings from 10:00—11:10 AM in the Office Annex to explore the Sunday scriptures. Everyone is invited, whether you can only come sporadically, or often. Participants find that regularly delving deep into the Word of God and understanding its context through the input of scripture scholars meaningfully connects their faith with their daily lives.

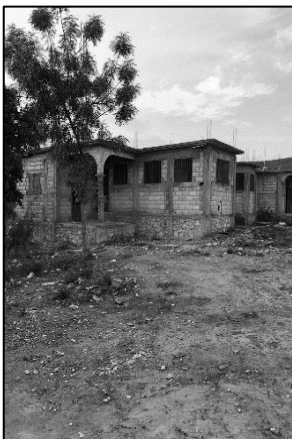

#### ST. ANTHONY HOUSE BUILDING UPDATE!

Many thanks to all who have and are contributing to our building fund for the new St. Anthony House for the homeless in Pointe-a-Raquette, Haiti. Fr. Augustin reports that they are working on the rough casting after encountering a delay while the Sloop (Haitian big wooden boat) was being repaired and the building supplies could not be shipped from the mainland. Once the rough casting is completed, louvered windows will be installed, the interior painted, and a gas stove will be procured. We will no longer be cooking outside on a charcoal fire –much better for the environment! By August if no further unseen delays, our residents will move in. There are also plans, as funds are raised, for a cistern and water system, as well as we hope solar power for electricity. Pictures will be on display at the Haiti Ministry sponsored coffee and donuts on Sunday, July 8<sup>th</sup>.
