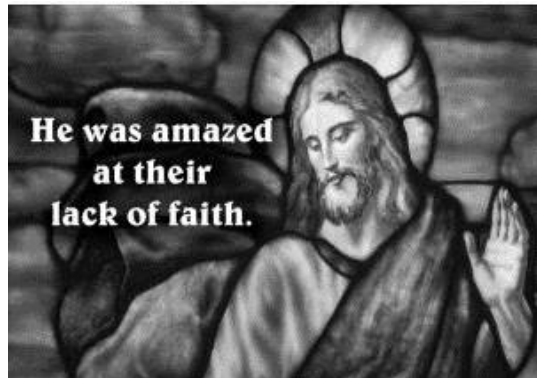

NURSES CORNER.

July 28, 2018 is World Hepatitis Day. Hepatitis C virus infects many people who do not have symptoms or feel ill. About 3.2 million people in the United States have chronic Hepatitis C and do not know it. If and when symptoms occur, it may be a sign of advanced liver disease. Baby Boomers, those born between 1945 and 1965, have the highest rates of incidence of Hepatitis C. Hep-C is spread primary through contact with blood of an infected person, even in amounts too small to see. It can be by tooth brush or razor, being a blood or organ recipient prior to 1992, having a needle stick, or injury resulting in exposure to infected blood, or IV drug use. Early diagnosis is important. If you feel you are at risk, discuss testing with your doctor. Healthline.com
