Q How can the assembly help the catechumens?

A In many ways! Through their friendly, welcoming demeanor toward catechumens, by learning their names, greeting them, and engaging them in conversation, assembly members reassure them that they have a place in the community. Most of the rites of initiation take place at Sunday Mass. By its attention and participation in these rites, the assembly expresses the community's care and encouragement for the catechumens. What's more, at every liturgy, catechumens look to assembly members as models, following their example and reflecting on the meaning of the rituals as they watch the assembly's responses. Welcoming the catechumens into parish activities not only makes them feel included, it also provides them glimpses of the life of disciples. Becoming a sponsor for a catechumen is yet another way assembly members could be helpful. Finally, the faithful can pray for the catechumens throughout the week.

CATECHUMENATE FOR THE PARISH – FOUNDATION OF MINISTRY continues:

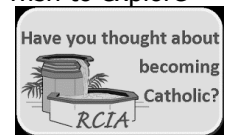
- ❖ Session Six, The Period of the Catechumenate, the second stage of the process is a "true school of faith" where catechumens are apprentices of the baptized members of the community. It is envisioned as a fruitful blend of instruction and formation in the faith during which the "catechumen's faith and conversion to God" grows and is nurtured by immersion in the community's way of life. Explore this with us on July 22 at 7:00 PM or July 23 at 1:00 PM in the O'Brien Family Room.
- ❖ Session Seven, The Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names formally concludes the Period of the Catechumenate, marks the start of the Period of Purification and Enlightenment, and is presided over by the bishop or in exceptional circumstances, his delegate. The Rite of Sending is envisioned by the US bishops is to provide the opportunity for the local parish to take part in initiation and testify to the catechumen's growth and ongoing conversion and to formally declare their ongoing support. Come join us July 29 at 7:00 PM or July 30 at 1:00 PM in the O'Brien Family Room.

RCIA CATECHETICAL SESSION. Our candidates, sponsors, and team will be exploring "The Eucharist and the Mass", Part Two – The Liturgy of the Word, on Sunday, July 21 in the O'Brien Family Room from 4:30—6:00 PM. And, on Sunday, July 28, we will examine in depth, the structure and prayers of the Liturgy of the Eucharist at the same place and time. Any adult in the parish is welcomed to these sessions. When you attend, you exercise your baptismal responsibility to witness to Jesus Christ, and help evangelize those seeking what you have! You may even discover something new and deepen your own experience of the Eucharist.

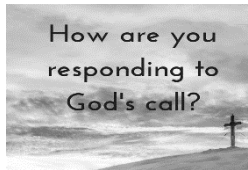
