

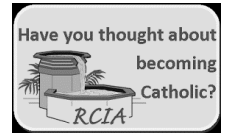

Q Why are the sacraments of initiation a beginning and not an end?



A *Initiation* comes from the Latin word *initiatio*. We often first think of it as "admission," and certainly Baptism is the doorway to all the sacraments. It can also be translated, "participation." St. Paul writes to the Christian community in Corinth, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" (1 Corinthians 10:16). Christian initiation and the ongoing nourishment of the Eucharist ultimately bring us into full participation with Christ's ministry, his suffering and death, and his Resurrection to new life.

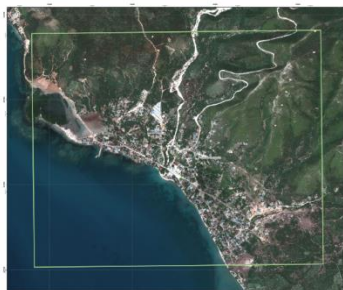

CATECHUMENATE FOR THE PARISH – FOUNDATION OF MINISTRY continues:

- ❖ Final Session Ten: The Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy. Mystagogy is the fourth period of the Rite of Initiation of Adults. Formal Mystagogy runs from Easter to Pentecost Sunday. This period of deepening the understanding of the Paschal Mystery is a time for the newly baptized/neophyte together with the baptized community to reflect on and unpack the ritual experiences and the experience of the Sacred Paschal Triduum. We will examine what the rite and national statutes say about what Mystagogy includes and explore the role that the parish has in accompanying the neophytes during their first year. The rites also calls the parish to gather the neophytes. The video, "The Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy," will help us break open this important period. Everyone is invited to join us in this last session on Monday, August 19 at 7:00 PM or Tuesday, August 20 at 1:00 PM.

Since 2011, St. John the Evangelist has been supporting St. Anthony House, providing a home to frail elderly and disabled residents of Pointe-a-Raquette who have no family support, as well as a food program for the very hungry in St. Louis King of France Parish. Our local Haiti ministry team partners with Fr. Augustin, the pastor, and members of his parish food and housing committee. Together, through your sacrificial offerings and the hard work of the Haitian people, we have expanded from four original residents to 10 current residents. Fr. Augustin will visit St. John's this October and we are planning our annual visit for January 2020. C.R.O.P. HUNGER WALK. Save the date for our community CROP Hunger Walk which will take place on Sunday, September 29 at 2:00 PM beginning at Ridgeview Park in Waynesboro. This year we are celebrating the 50th Anniversary of CROP Walk nationally & our 44th year of walking in this community. We need your help!
