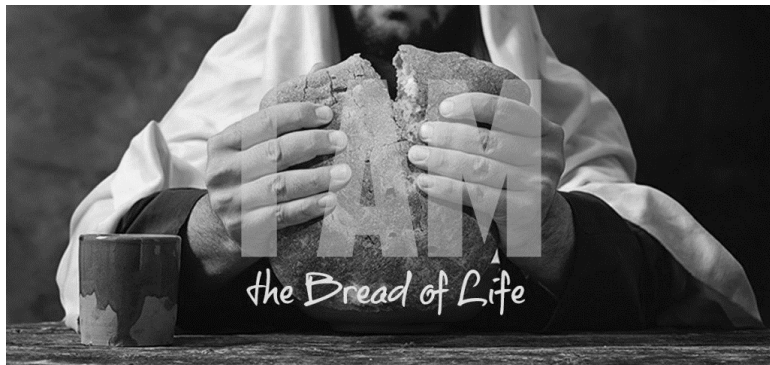





The conference theme was "Running the Race: Passing the Torch". The weekend was comprised of general sessions and workshops with dynamic speakers, mass, prayer, and adoration. The speakers were great and the camaraderie among fellow Catholic Christians even better! Here are a few reflections from the trip:



"The conference always energizes my faith and it is something I look forward to all year. One moment that stood out was Fr. Meconi's description of a conversation he had with a stranger. The person asked him if he was saved. He answered he didn't know. The person then asked if he had a personal relationship with Jesus. Father answered that he did but he didn't want one. The stranger was shocked and asked why. Father Meconi explained that a personal relationship is like a friendship with Jesus walking next to you. He wants to be fully united with Jesus, not next to him, but in Christ and with Christ in him. That was powerful and reminded me how much closer I want to be to Jesus. There were numerous moments like that, and I'll be working on trying to live them."—GC

"My experience at Defending the Faith conference has not only reinforced my faith- both in the Lord and in our church- but has also inspired me to add more learning to my routine. The experience is not about the feelings obtained, though enjoyable, but for me to continue my Catholic education and opportunity to grow my faith. I further realize that my Catholicism is not a Sunday event, but all day and every day. I encourage all parishioners to consider such conferences and retreats as a normal part of our experience. We need to keep learning regardless of our age or knowledge."—BB Ask any who attended the conference about their experience and then make plans to attend next year. The theme of next year's Defending the Faith is "Christ: The Power and Wisdom of God" and will take place July 26-28, 2019.
