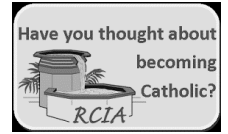

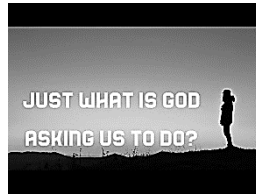

- Discovery was my turning point in my faith. Before it my faith was not very strong but the retreat changed my relationship with God in a good way and now I can just improve and help others too. (KO)
- When I went to Discovery I didn't want to go, to say the least. In fact, my mother didn't tell me where we were going till we were half way there because she knew I wouldn't go otherwise. I spent the first 2/3 of the retreat closed off, wishing I was anywhere else. But between the kindness, patience, and commitment of the team members and the work of God I finally opened myself to why I was there. This retreat changed my life in a very real way. I've become a different person on a mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual level. I don't know where I would be today without Discovery, but I'm so blessed I'll never find out. Thank you Discovery! (KM)
- I didn't want to go initially, but once I got comfortable with everyone I learned so much about myself and my faith while creating lasting connections with people and God. (AG)
- When I went to discovery I wasn't sure what to expect. I quickly learned that it was going to be a great experience. Throughout the weekend I learned that Jesus loves me no matter what I've done and he is always willing to forgive me and I learned that you can see Jesus through other people. (AD)
