PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN training program will take place on Saturday, September 15 in the O'Brien Family Room. This is the VIRTUS program for the protection of children and vulnerable adults from sexual abuse. "Protecting God's Children" is an introductory 3-hour awareness session for adults in the faith community who interact with minors. Participants are taught to identify situations that could leave a child or adult vulnerable, the methods employed by sexual offenders, and some critical steps to help prevent abuse. When we hear about the efforts the Church makes in preventing sexual abuse, we often hear about the importance of compliance with the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Dallas Charter). From a faith environment perspective, the importance is not in our compliance, but in our calling. As Catholics we are called to respect the life and dignity of every human person from conception to natural death. The Charter guides us in action to our calling. Our calling furthers the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. This is one of the many ways that we can demonstrate care and protection for the least among us.

ORDINARY TIME DURING FALL. As September begins, we continue our observance of Ordinary Time—Year B, in the Lectionary with the Gospel according to Mark as our guide. Simultaneously, we experience the end of summer, and the beginning of a new school year with all its inherent busyness. As well, the preparations for autumn remind us that the earth is preparing for the long slumber of winter. 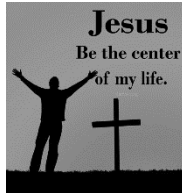

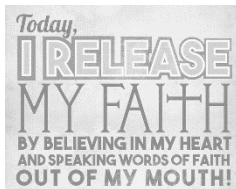

HAITI MINISTRY – SOLIDARITY AND SUBSIDIARITY

Two principles of Catholic Social Teaching are modeled at our sister parish in Pointe-a-Raquette, LaGonave, Haiti. When we visited last February, we (Sue Pauly & Jeanne Branch) discussed with the pastor, Fr. Augustin, our concerns that some of the young children whose families receive rice, beans, and oil, through our food program were displaying some signs of malnourishment/vitamin deficiency. Solidarity is “a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say, to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all truly responsible for each other (St. John Paul II). Subsidiarity is the principle that “a community of a higher order should not interfere in the internal life of a community of a lower order, depriving the latter of its functions, but rather should support it in case of need and help to co-ordinate its activity with the activities of the rest of society, always with a view to the common good.” Rather than having a vitamin drive here and bringing vitamins from the outside, Fr. Augustin organized his parishioners, and with the help of the clinic staff and local Haitian experts, the community obtained a grinder/mill. Using moringa and other vitamin sources, they created a nutrient dense powder that can be mixed into the food such as mamba (peanut butter) and enrich the diet of the school children and our food program participants. Bon travail! (Good job!)
