HAITI MINISTRY. At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Fr. Augustin started broadcasting Mass in Pointe-a-Raquette. He also used a loudspeaker and encouraged social distancing for all services. Other community groups encouraged social distancing and hand washing to prevent the spread of illness. Father Augustin and our interpreter, James, set up hand washing stations throughout the community. The stations consist of a bucket of water and soap. Water is available in community wells. Families gather what is needed in their buckets to transport to their homes.

Children assist by carrying small containers. While not reporting on known cases, we are aware that community members report fevers. Testing is not being promoted in Haiti. Symptoms are treated. Monthly funds from St. John help to make a minimum of one meal a day possible for St. Anthony House residents and others in the food program. Mesi Anpil!

THIS YEAR'S CROP WALK theme is "Gratitude and Grace," returning our thanks to God for God's generous blessings by giving to others. The Waynesboro-East Augusta CROP Walk encourage you to share your stories of Gratitude and Grace on their Facebook page, and tell others how you are preparing for this special Walk this year. Record something you are grateful for. This is the 45th year of CROP walk in Waynesboro! This year, instead of one event where we are all together, with concern for everyone's safety, we will observe CROP for a week instead, from Sunday, September 20—Sunday, September 27.
