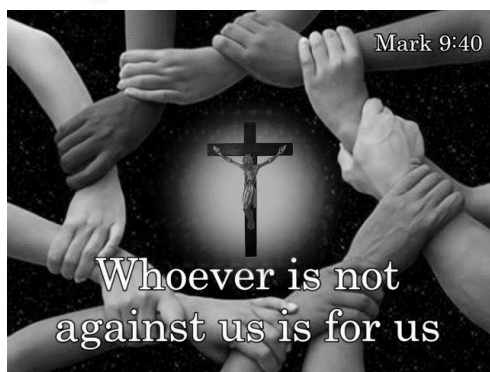

Please note: children 12 years of age and under must be accompanied by an adult to the restroom during Mass or any church event!







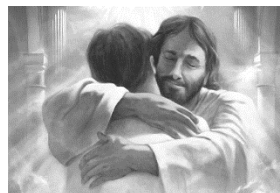

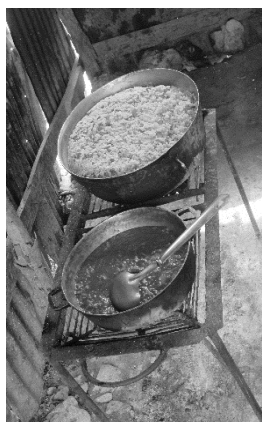

LA FORMACIÓN DE LA FE PREGUNTA DE LA SEMANA

ST. ANTHONY HOUSE – A TYPICAL DAY



The day starts early at St. Anthony House as most of the residents are up and about. Some attend the 6:00 AM Mass at the church, and by 7:00 AM, Manette, our cook has arrived and has started a charcoal fire in the outdoor kitchen to boil water and start cooking the espageti (spaghetti) which is breakfast for the residents. Once that is done, she starts the long preparations for the main meal of the day, rice, beans, and sauce. The vegetables for flavoring are readied (no pre-cut, pre-washed ingredients). Coconuts are opened and then grated by hand to make coconut milk. This is used to flavor the sauce, which is prepared from smashing cooked beans by hand into a paste. While this is happening, Madame Elaisson arrives and helps the residents to bathe ... outside with a bucket and a large bowl. She will later wash their clothes by hand and hang them to dry. Around 11:30 AM the residents and the other villagers who get a hot meal arrive and lunch is served. Then Manette goes out with a big heavy pot, bringing meals to the homebound, and those who walk several miles on foot. (Meals on Feet!) Things will change for the better shortly, thanks to your generous donations when the new St. Anthony House indoor kitchen is finished, and they finally get a gas stove!
