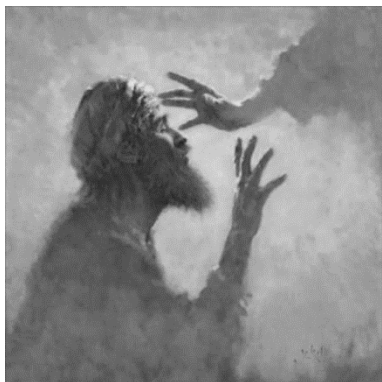

FROM MASS TO MISSION

Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life

WEEK OF 27 OCTOBER–02 NOVEMBER: CHAPTER THREE – THE LITURGY OF THE WORD. This week, we focus on understanding that when the Word of God is proclaimed in the readings at Mass, Christ himself is speaking to us. We explore the liturgical season plan of the three-year cycle of our Lectionary (book of scripture readings) and the important role of silence in helping us to listen to and receive the Word of God each week.

WEEK OF 03–09 NOVEMBER: CHAPTER FOUR – THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST. This week, we focus on understanding that the Preparation of the Gifts is our participation in the sacrifice of Christ. Sections of the Liturgy of the Eucharist connect us in thanksgiving and gratitude to being opened and changed into the likeness of Christ. Each part, particularly the Consecration and the Words of Institution, and Reception of Holy Communion deepen our participation in this great Paschal Mystery. 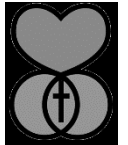

THE MARCH FOR LIFE takes place on January 17-18, 2019. The Office for Evangelization sponsors an annual Diocesan-wide delegation to the annual March for Life in Washington DC. The March for Life marks the anniversary of the landmark decision of the Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* which made abortion legal in the United States. The delegation is primarily intended for middle and high school youth, campus ministry students, and young adults. This is a two-day pilgrimage where participants attend the "Life is VERY Good" evening of prayer, then stay overnight in Northern Virginia, and then participate in the morning "Life is VERY Good" youth rally and Mass, before traveling by bus to the March for Life in downtown Washington DC. The cost is \$45 for Youth Participants (ages 11-17), \$25 for College students, and \$55 for adult chaperones. All buses will be scheduled to arrive in Woodbridge VA by 7:00 PM at the EagleBank Arena (formerly the Patriot Center) on the campus of George Mason University. We will NOT know our departure time until January 4 when the Diocesan bus routes will be established based on those who are attending. Contact Michele Kresge for additional information. This a high-energy, 2 ½ hour renewal event designed to bring a brand new energy and vitality. The event has two parts: (1) It begins with an inspirational, high-energy unpacking of the genius of the heart of the Gospel, revealing its power and real beauty.
