HAITI MINISTRY – WORLD DAY OF THE POOR NOVEMBER 18, 2018

Pope Francis in his message for the Second Annual World Day of the Poor writes, "It is necessary that the poor perceive the presence of brothers and sisters who show concern for them and who, by opening the door of their hearts and lives, make them feel like friends and family." Our Haiti Ministry focuses on forming and supporting long term relationships with our brothers and sisters at St. Louis King of France parish in Pointe-au-Raquette, Haiti. We will celebrate the World Day of the Poor here at St. John's by introducing the children in our Christian Formation program to the people and ministry in Haiti. During formation time, they will experience different stations that will teach them about life in a country where material possessions are few, where children have important duties including obtaining water for their families, where food is simple and not abundant, where soccer is played with homemade equipment. DIOCESAN YOUTH CONFERENCE (DYC). This event is for youth in 8-12th grade and is a highly energetic, engaging, and awesome opportunity for high school teenagers to gather as a larger Church community and celebrate the amazing richness of our Catholic Christian faith. The conference is in Richmond, February 9—11. The theme is Christ Our Hope and the keynote speakers are Jackie Francois Angel and Sean Forrest. Jackie is a speaker, worship leader, and author from Orange County, CA. Sean is a missionary, author, singer/songwriter, evangelist, and cofounder or Haiti180. Registration forms are on the parish website and in the Christian Formation office. The cost is \$150. Scholarships are available.

THE MARCH FOR LIFE. The Office for Evangelization sponsors an annual Diocesan-wide delegation to the annual March for Life in Washington DC on January 17-18, 2019. The March for Life marks the anniversary of the landmark decision of the Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* which made abortion legal in the United States. The delegation is primarily intended for middle and high school youth, campus ministry students, and young adults. This two-day pilgrimage includes the "Life is VERY Good" evening of prayer for participants, then an



overnight stay in Northern Virginia, and in the morning taking part in the "Life is VERY Good" youth rally and Mass, before traveling by bus to the March for Life in downtown Washington DC. The cost is \$45 for Youth Participants (ages 11-17), \$25 for College students, and \$55 for adult chaperones. All buses will be scheduled to arrive in Woodbridge VA by 7:00 PM at the EagleBank Arena (formerly the Patriot Center) on the campus of George Mason University. We will NOT know our departure time until January 4 when the Diocesan bus routes will be established based on those who are attending. Contact Michele Kresge for information. REBOOT with Chris Stefanick, is Wednesday, November 28 from 7:00—9:30 PM at St. Thomas More Catholic Church, Lynchburg VA. This is a high-energy, 2½ hour renewal event designed to bring a brand new energy and vitality. The event has two parts: (1) It begins with an inspirational, high-energy unpacking of the genius of the heart of the Gospel, revealing its power and real beauty. The experience is fresh and compelling, and is like hearing the Gospel for the first time all over again! People commonly say: "THAT reminded me – all over again – why I ever even wanted to be a Christian, to be a Catholic!" There is a lot of laughter, and there are some real tears. And, (2) it finishes strong with real-life, practical, "can-do" ways of applying the genius of the Gospel in everyday life. From prayer and spirituality, to work, dating, marriage, parenting, health, and more!

SEASON OF ADVENT. "Advent has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the endo of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight." *Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and The General Roman Calendar (UNLY, 39)*

As we begin the new liturgical year with Advent, we are once again reminded of the joyful expectation to which we are called as members of Christ's Body, the Church. Celebrating Advent well helps us to understand and celebrate Christmas more profoundly. Although separate periods of liturgical time, they are best appreciated together. During Advent, the time of expectation, we are reminded of the coming of Christ not only at Christmas, but of his Second Coming in glory at the end of time. This is a time of grace, a time for a new advent of Jesus into our lives. Our attention is drawn to the light that brings brightness to the darkest places of our lives. Christ will come again in glory, lead us from darkness, and make us his own. The liturgical celebrations echo that feeling of hope and expectation about Christ's return and the reality that our preparation for his return in now.

In our Advent celebrations, we find a strong emphasis on issues of justice and peace. On the First Sunday of Advent, we are called to prepare for the Second Coming of the Lord and to celebrate Christ's entry into our lives by living as men, women, and children of justice who work for a more peaceful world. And yet, we know that the commercial world has come to dominate our Advent preparations, causing us at times to miss the real wealth that Advent holds forth for those who immerse themselves in its unfolding celebrations.

For many, Advent is not that time when we pause to reflect on the promise of Christ's return to that point called the "end times." In our day-to-day lives, we find ourselves somewhat ready, usually tired, but not prepared. The expectation, the waiting, which is the posture of the Christian during Advent, seems lost in the shuffle of pre-Christmas hysteria. Yet the great figures that we meet in the Advent liturgies (the prophets Jeremiah, Baruch, Zephaniah, and Micah, along with John the Baptist and Mary, the mother of Jesus) remind us of the importance of listening, paying attention, patient waiting, and hope-filled living.
