ST. ANTHONY FOOD PROGRAM NOVEMBER 2018 REPORT

Fr. Augustin expresses his great gratitude for all who have helped him feed the people in Pointe-au-Raquette Haiti. Our monthly donation helps him to feed and care for the residents of St. Anthony's House and provide a hot cooked meal to other elderly or handicapped people who have no means to cook. In addition, raw food allotments of rice, beans, and oil are distributed to families in need.

MARCH FOR LIFE. The Office for Evangelization sponsors an annual Diocesan-wide delegation to the annual March for Life in Washington DC on January 17-18, 2019. The March for Life marks the anniversary of the landmark decision of the Supreme Court in Roe v. Wade, which made abortion legal in the United States. The delegation is primarily intended for middle and high school and college youth, and young adults. This two-day pilgrimage includes the "Life is VERY Good" evening of prayer for participants, then an overnight stay in Northern Virginia, and in the morning participation in the "Life is VERY Good" youth rally and Mass, before transport by bus to the March for Life in downtown Washington DC. The cost is \$45 for Youth Participants (ages 11-17), \$25 for College students, and \$55 for adult chaperones. Contact Michele Kresge for additional information. DIOCESAN YOUTH CONFERENCE (DYC).
