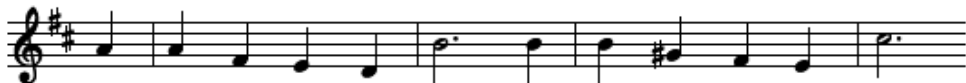
ENTRANCE HYMN : CROWN HIM WITH MANY CROWNS

3. Through-out the earth his praise re-sounds For he is Lord of all.

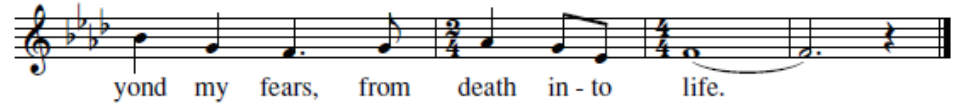
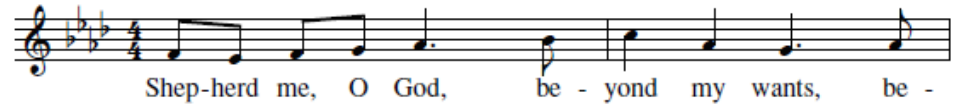
