

Pope Francis has compared the Church to a Field Hospital. It is a place we bring someone who is injured to receive immediate attention so that they can be stabilized and then moved for more long-term care. We live in a fallen broken world. We are effected by sin and all that entails. There isn't any of us who has it all together so to speak, we all have some skeletons or stuff we're dealing with in our lives.

The Church has been given to us by Christ to carry on His work of healing by bringing His mercy to those who need it. He has blessed us with His Spirit, which is a Spirit of healing and consolation as well as a spirit of fortitude. The Church is the great dispenser of mercy and everything about her exists to make people's lives better.



Last year the Administrative Council struggled with writing a mission statement for our parish. I believe it was time well spent, although at times it seemed that we would never arrive at a couple sentences to sum up who we are and who we are striving to be. But the Holy Spirit guided us and finally we wrote:

St. Mary's is a community of people called and renewed by God to live a life of holiness as a part of the Body of Christ in union with the Pope and Local Bishop. It is a mission carrying on Christ's work of healing a broken world through worship, the proclamation of God's wonderful works and serving with acts of mercy.

That is what we are about. Dispensing mercy to a broken world and this means growing in holiness, becoming more like God who sent His Divine Son to heal this disordered world.

Thus, God filled His Church with mercy so that people would not have to wander aimlessly without hope and despairing. The greatest gift of the priesthood and, at the same time the most humbling and challenging, is the power to forgive sins. In spite of the fact that we live in a culture and society that denies the reality of sin, human beings still know deep down that there is a right and wrong and that they need God to heal them and at the same time we need to hear the words, "You are forgiven."

The genius of Catholicism is that it knows that we as people with bodies and souls, need the visible, the tangible to be healed. It isn't enough to just spiritually say, "Lord forgive me." We need to speak our sins and hear the words, "I forgive you." We need that between friends and we need it from our great friend Jesus. In the Sacrament of Penance we find our deepest healing. When we are healed in the inners of our souls we truly begin to heal and know peace.

May each of us hear these beautiful words this Lent, "I absolve you..."



Tenebrae at St. Marys, Sleepy Eye Good Friday, March 30 at 8:30 PM




Divine Mercy Sunday April 8, 2018

2:00-3:00 pm: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions 3:00 pm: Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction





The fiscal year is half over with the budget doing well six months in. The parishioners of St. Mary's were extremely generous over the Christmas season. The Christmas collection was the largest in recent years at \$69,000.00. The adult envelopes are ahead of budget by over \$52,000.00 which is \$20,000.00 ahead of last year at this time. This is good because Sunday giving trends decrease during the months of January and February and the cushion helps us meet our obligations during those months. Over \$9,000.00 was given to the Adopt-A-Student program during the month of December. I know those families really appreciate the help they receive from this fund. St. Mary's is only able to fund 35% to 40% of the tuition assistance need determined by FAIR. The Adopt-A-Student program is a great way to help fill the gap of that need. Thank you for your generosity in support of St. Mary's Church and School.


