




Solemnity of So. Peter and Paul

Each year on June 29, we celebrate the Solemnity of Ss. Peter and Paul, therefore we chose to showcase the statues of Peter and Paul on the cover. These statues adorn our high altar in St. Mary's Church. I am grateful for the presence

of those two saints in such a prominent position in our Church. They are on either side of the Tabernacle, which is rich theologically. In the tabernacle we have the Sacramental Presence of Jesus in our midst, so it is appropriate that nearby we have the two men that were so intimately connected to Jesus, Ss. Peter and Paul. St. Peter chosen by Jesus to be the head of the apostles and thus head of the Church and St. Paul chosen by Jesus and known as the Apostle to the Gentiles. They both gave powerful witness to Jesus and indeed gave the ultimate, their lives. They were martyred (meaning witness) for their belief in Jesus as their resurrected Lord.



Be grateful to God for the gift of these two great men. Their lives were an outpouring of love for Jesus and the people they served. They become powerful intercessors for us in heaven as we make this journey here on earth and they become powerful examples for us.

They, in spite of countless attacks from the world around them and from within, carried on preaching and living the Gospel. They guided the young fledgling community of believers and helped it continue to expand as they traveled from their homeland to make Jesus known.

We, who are alive today, are inheritors of their deep faith and love of the Church. We too are barraged by countless attacks on our faith. Our culture is inimical (hostile) to the faith. This is not surprising since Jesus himself warned us that this would be the case. Since the world did not accept Jesus, neither will it be welcoming to His followers. But fortunately, we have the prayer of Jesus himself (I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word. Jn. 17:20), to give us strength and we have the prayer and powerful witness of Ss. Peter and Paul who gave themselves totally for the faith.

We must do today that which Ss. Peter and Paul did so admirably in view of the difficult circumstances of their time; they clung to Jesus and they formed disciples. They never tired of praying, studying and preaching the Word of God. In that they found strength. We are called to do the same. We must pray and pray continually that we never lose heart. Prayer needs to be the foundation of our faith lives. Indeed, if it isn't we will not have a faith life. For a relationship with Jesus cannot continue without communication. And we need to study the faith. We need to take every opportunity to reflect on the Word of God and study its content. And finally, we must insert ourselves more fully into the life of the Church, the community of Jesus' followers. For the Church is the Body of Christ. In that community we have the sacraments of which the Eucharist is central.

Last spring as I was sitting in church waiting for Mass to begin, some people caught my eye. There were a few young adults sitting toward the front of church who I did not remember seeing before. There was some whispering between the three of them and then they took out their

phones and began taking pictures of the church's interior. It gave me pause and brought home a reality for me that I had long forgotten: our church is incredible! Sometimes you take for granted the beautiful things that are around you, and you need to be reminded occasionally.

Josh Sellner is one of those unique people who has never needed to be reminded of the beautiful architectural treasure that is this church. In fact, when asked about his Head Maintenance position at St. Mary's, he stated that the best part of his job is taking care of this church and the organ, "They are very special to me."

Josh was born and raised in Sleepy Eye, the son of John and Vicki (Juenemann) Sellner. John is employed at Haala Industries and Vicki is a nurse in the surgery department at the Sleepy Eye Medical Center. "I have loved this church my whole life. One of my earliest memories of working in the church is when I was about 11 or 12 years old. My dad was working on fixing the steeple clocks. I remember being in the steeple with him when the bells began to ring the Angelus. I got so scared. I now consider those steeples and the attic some of the most interesting areas of the church." Family has been a large part of Josh's life. Both of his parents come from large families, and Josh and his brother Noah were able to spend a lot of time with their Grandma and Grandpa Sellner while growing up. Noah is married to Jennifer Arkfeld and lives in Harlan, Iowa.

After graduating from St. Mary's School in 2006, Josh continued his education by attending Minnesota West in Jackson where he received his diploma in the electrician program. After graduation in 2008, he held various positions in the area including working at Zinniel Electric for three years. At that point he was encouraged by Sarah Jirak to apply for an open position in the maintenance de-

partment at St. Mary's. He applied and was offered the position. He considers it a privilege to be able to take care of St. Mary's campus. Each area is different and holds its own unique challenges. "If I had to choose one area of this job that I could do without, it's probably the snow removal,



especially on all the steps. But, it's Minnesota; what are you going to do?" Care of the cemetery also came with the maintenance position. "I remember visiting the cemetery two to three times a summer, remembering family and paying our respects. In the end, I guess it's because I love art, and this church is filled with beautiful art. It's the reason that I stuck around Sleepy Eye after graduation." In his spare time Josh has a concertina repair and manufacturing business. "My Grandma and Grandpa Sellner were old-tyme music lov-

ers, so I grew up loving it too." With the encouragement of his dad, he got his first concertina at the age of 13 and taught himself how to play it. "I like to tinker with mechanical things, whether they be pipe organs or concertinas or anything else. It was literally through tinkering with concertinas that I learned how to repair them, and later on how to build them. I gave my mom quite a scare once when she came into my bedroom and found the one for which they had just paid over \$7,000 taken apart." Josh is also very active as a regular altar server and attendee at the Traditional Latin Mass in our parish. "We currently have between nine to 11 boys that I am training as servers. Our average attendance is growing and we currently have around 100 people attending each Sunday. The Latin Mass is seeing a resurgence among my generation, and we are very fortunate that we have a church here that is still intact from when the Latin Mass was the normal rite. Our parish council knew what they were doing when they decided not to make any drastic changes to the interior of the church during the period after the second Vatican Council. It assists in reminding us as a Church of our heritage and patrimony."





Our budget is going well. Adult envelopes in the Sunday offertory continue to be above budget for the year. However, giving has decreased over the last month. The adult envelopes for the fiscal year are budgeted at \$620,000.00. Adult envelopes are one of the most important revenue sources for the parish. Due to a more realistic budget for adult envelopes, we should come close to meeting it this year. This 2017-2018 fiscal year, the parish needs to provide a subsidy to the school of \$649,101.67. As you can see, this is why your Sunday giving is so important. The less that is given to meet the adult envelopes, the harder it is for the parish to pay the subsidy. If the parish cannot afford the subsidy, the school has to look to other revenue sources to make up the difference like tuition, fundraising, etc.


Totus Tuus (Totally Yours)


