A Message from Fr. Mark Steffl

On the cover of this issue is a picture of Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament that we had at the conclusion of the October Rosary Procession in Sleepy Eye to mark the month of the Holy Rosary, October. It seemed particularly fitting in this year of "Eucharistic Revival" that we are

focusing on in the United States. I think we are seeing some good results from this year's focus on the Holy Eucharist, and It's importance in our lives as individuals, families, parishes and our school.

During this time as we focus on the Holy Eucharist, some things we look forward to offering you include a talk from speaker Barbara Heil, along with gifting you the book, *Beautiful Eucharist* for Advent (sponsored by the Council of Catholic Women), gifting the book, *The Bishop of the Abandoned Tabernacle* during Lent and a visit from Msgr. James Shea (who is president of the University of Mary in Bismarck) who will preach the homilies at Mass one weekend in Lent. Our AFC Holy Hours have been successful as we dedicate a Sunday Holy Hour at each of the four churches in our AFC.

Below is a picture of the two angels that are at the gate of St. Mary's Cemetery. Every time I went to the cemetery, I pondered why they were without their trumpets. I was finally able to find someone who was able to make the trumpets that are shown in the picture. I wasn't able to locate a picture of them with the trumpets, so I don't know if they ever had them, or if they disappeared at some time in history. (If anyone knows, I would be interested in hearing from you...) The angels with trumpets are an

image from the Book of Revelation that announce the Second Coming of the Lord.

The schedule for Advent and Christmas is included in this issue as well. This year, Advent is the shortest that it can be, as Christmas is the day after the 4th Sunday of Advent. (Last year, Christmas was on a Sunday so we had four full weeks of Advent.) There are many opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation listed, and I would like to encourage everyone to find a time to prepare their hearts with that Sacrament so as to be ready to meet the Christ Child in the manger at Christmas.

Lastly, thanks to everyone for your continued generosity! Over these last three years, we have been able to accomplish so much in terms of keeping up with different maintenance projects - the new terrazzo floor in the church, a new elevator in the school, repairing the altars and Communion rail (next year) and most recently some significant landscaping and drainage tiling around the church and rectory. This year, with the recommendation of the administrative council, the money that comes back to the parish from the Diocesan Ministries Appeal (DMA) will go to our maintenance fund. In my weekly bulletin comments, I mentioned looking into replacing the concrete in the rectory garage (which is a terrible broken mess). We are also working on re-keying the school, which is a huge project considering the amount of doors requiring quite a large key ring. This will standardize things considerably.

Our stewardship is a reflection of our understanding of how much the Lord has blessed us, and it is by our participation that we continue to carry out the mission of the Church in our parish!

God gave us, the staff of Divine Providence Community Home, a brief opportunity to acquaint ourselves with Ivan Victor Kotten and to become some of the many people within Ivan's 101 years of life.

He was the son of John and Theckla Kotten, born on December 27, 1921. He grew up with three sisters and one brother and finished eighth grade at St. Mary's School in Sleepy Eye. The John Kotten family would either take their Model T on nice days or their sleigh and horses to attend St. Mary's Masses. The only offset

to the cold were wrapped heated bricks placed within their sled.

Farming halted for Ivan and military service began in 1942 with a military draft into the 91st Infantry. Following his honorable discharge in 1943, he went on to meet his future wife, Florence Schweiss at a Gibbon Ballroom dance. The couple married on April 24, 1946, and Ivan recalled how the parish priest milked the goats before their 9 a.m. wedding. Together they raised six children and resided on a farm north of Sleepy Eye.



Gifts and talents in service to the Church were seen and unseen. Usher, lecturer, and commentator were a few of Ivan's gifts seen at weekly Masses. Behind the scenes, Ivan unassumingly served his Church community. An example shared included how he traveled from one parishioner to another gathering money to build a "home for the aging" in Sleepy Eye. No one wanted the task, but Ivan quietly said "yes," and ground was broken October 20, 1959, for what is now known as Divine Providence Community Home.

A 101-year-old man of our community gave of his time, talent, and treasure and his spirit humbled us. He resolutely found a way to attend daily Mass and he spoke with gentleness, humor, and grace that encouraged all of us to continue our walk with God.

Our work life at Divine provides us many opportunities to meet many beautiful souls. Most assuredly, Ivan was one of them.

Shortly after he agreed to do this article, Ivan was called Home to God. Surely, he was met with the words "Well done, good and faithful servant." May he rest in peace.

Meet Barbara Heil


Barbara grew up on the West Coast, and as a student, had a life-changing encounter with the love of Christ. She crossed the country to Ashland, Virginia where she learned a life of prayer, worship, and devotion at an international ministry community. Her hands-on training included kid's camps, inner city ministry, missions, ministry to the poor, and crusades around the world.

Barbara was part of the staff at the Calvary Campground in Ashland, Virginia for over 20 years. Her ministry experience is wide and varied, from living in Hong Kong to minister in Asia, to living in Jerusalem, to being on staff at a street mission in San Diego, CA to minister to the needs of the homeless during the beginning of the AIDS outbreak.

She has ministered all over the world, has been a missionary, an evangelist, and pastor. She has spent the last few years traveling the U.S. and the world over conducting worship seminars, retreats, and conferences, leading mission trips, offering prayer and counseling, and seeing thousands healed and set free inside and out, equipping lives for the Glory of God.

Barbara did not know until recently that she had been baptized as a child in the Catholic Church, and after much prayer and deliberation, she received the Rite of Confirmation in St Paul, Minnesota in April of 2013. Today, based in Iowa, Barbara continues to be involved in a wide spectrum of Christian endeavor.

A widow for eight years, Barbara has recently married! She lives in Iowa with her husband, Jeff. She is the joyful mother of four and grandmother of two! Together she and Jeff have 8 children and 10 grandkids!





Books are available to purchase for \$25 at the parish or school office, Randy's Family Drug and Gift and the Nex-Tu-Nu II store.




