
Church of the Japanese Martyrs

ANNUAL PARISH FESTIVAL & OTHER ACTIVITIES

Japanese Martyrs Church holds its annual Parish Dinner and Festival on the last Sunday of July. We ask all members to help with this major event by selling and purchasing raffle and dinner tickets and giving of their time to work at the festival. In addition to our parish festival, our Administrative Council hosts a Volkswagen Dinner, sponsored by the Catholic United Financial as a matching grant, on the last Sunday of February. The Parish of the Japanese Martyrs also has pancake breakfasts, beginning in the fall one Sunday each month during winter, sponsored by the Catholic United Financial as a matching grant.

CONTRIBUTION ENVELOPES

Each parish member ages 6 and up receives contribution envelopes in December of each year. This box contains weekly and special collection envelopes. Each adult is to give serious prayer and thought to how they can financially support their parish and its programs.

HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC UNITED FINANCIAL (CUF)

Members of the parish who have elected to take out insurance from the Catholic United Financial become members of the local parish association known as the Holy Family Society. This association sponsors matching grant programs which help to raise funds for religious education programs in the parish. The association members elect local officers and hold four meetings a year.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS (KC's)

Men of the parish who have elected to join this organization belong to the St. Mary's Council #3134 connected with the Church of St. Mary's in Sleepy Eye. This organization meets on a regular monthly basis and is involved in many projects throughout the year. March and October meetings at JM.

RENTALS

Church Hall & School Hall

It shall be the policy of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs to rent the church hall to families, individuals, businesses, and civic organizations and others under the following conditions:

- A. A fee of \$50.00 is to be <u>paid in advance</u>, for the one time use of the church hall, <u>for members</u> and nonmembers.
- B. Permission for the use of the hall shall be obtained before using the hall **only** from the Parish Office Administrator. For scheduling the use of the hall and collecting rent, please call the Parish Office 794-6974.
- C. The user of the hall shall leave the hall clean and in good order. If this is not done, the renter will be charged a \$75.00 cleaning fee and/or be refused the use of the hall in the future.
- D. The one who rents the church hall shall take all responsibility for any damages or loss that may occur.
- E. All who use the church hall are expected to be out of the hall and off the church premises no later than 1:00 a.m.
- F. See pages 8 & 9 for Hall/Kitchen rules.
- G. Insurance coverage for special events: Persons or groups renting parish property for a special event must have insurance to cover their event. If the event involves more than 75 people and/or alcohol, this coverage must be in the amount of at least \$500,000 Bodily Injury & Property Damage Liability Insurance and Host Liquor Liability (if liquor is being served). Homeowners Insurance will usually cover these types of events (renters should check with their Homeowners insurer to verify that their policy limit is sufficient to cover these events). For more information please call the Parish Office 794-6974.

It shall be the policy of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs to allow the use of the church hall rentfree for all parish organizations and parish functions as well as the Leavenworth 4-H club and Boy Scouts. (This policy applies to the rental of the parish school hall as well).

Guidelines for Kitchen and Hall Use

(To be used as a check list for Hall Rentals, Hall Use, Chairpersons serving Funerals, Pancake Breakfast, etc.)

- Remove coffee grounds/filters from coffee maker and discard them in the garbage. Clean the coffee maker as per cleaning instructions by coffeemaker.
- No dishes, serving plates, coffee servers, roasters, or kettles are to be taken from the kitchen.
- All food brought in for a funeral or event is to be taken home. No food is to be left in the
 refrigerators! Empty all dishes that are brought and wash them. Give the extra food to the
 family or have workers divide up and take home. To take food home or to send it home with
 the family, please use plastic containers or food wrap found in the cupboard.
- Check faucets, burners, lights, and the exhaust fan to be sure these are off before leaving.
- Garbage is to be placed in the dumpster outside the rectory garage door. New garbage bags should be replaced in the garbage cans.
- · Tables and chairs should be wiped clean.
- The kitchen and hall floors are to be swept. (Wipe up any spills on the hall floor).
- All chairs are to be pushed under the tables in orderly fashion.
- Kitchen floor is to be damp mopped after each use. Scrub bucket and mops are in the Janitor's Closet under the kitchen steps.
- Dishtowels and dishcloths are to be washed and returned ASAP. Return and put them back into the proper cabinet were they were found.
- Table decorations only. All decorations must be removed.
- If supplies are needed (coffee, filters, salt/pepper etc.) contact the Parish Office at 794-6974 or <a href="maintain:

Tables & Chairs

It shall be the policy of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs to rent the **white plastic tables and chairs** to families who are **members** of the parish.

- A. A fee of \$25.00 is to be paid in advance, for the one time use of the white plastic tables and chairs, no matter how many are used. A \$50 damage deposit is also required at this time.
- B. Permission for the use of these tables and chairs shall be obtained from the Administrative Assistant, who shall be responsible for scheduling the rental. Please call the Parish Office 794-6974. Pick up and return times are Monday, Tuesday and Friday 8am until 2pm, or by special arrangement.
- C. The renter of the tables and chairs shall return them in good and clean condition. If this is the case, the \$50 damage deposit will be returned. If this is not the case, the renter will be billed the cost of replacement, less their \$50 damage deposit.
- D. The parishioner who rents the tables and chairs shall take **all responsibility** for any damages or loss that may occur.
- E. Notice of any broken tables or chairs shall be made to the parish administrative assistant.
- F. Tables (owned by church) and chairs (owned by MCC) in the school are **not** available for rent.

Bleachers

A fee of \$25.00/pair with a maximum of 2 days, and a charge of \$25.00 per day thereafter. A damage deposit of \$150.00 is mandatory upon rental of bleachers. Fee will be returned if no damage to the bleachers has occurred.

Picnic Tables

The picnic tables located at the Leavenworth softball field are **NOT FOR RENT.**

FUNERAL POLICY

Parishioners

Registered members of the parish are reminded that it is a custom in Catholic Parishes that a stole fee be given to the church when a member of the parish community is given a Christian Burial and Funeral Mass. The family or individual shall determine this stole fee. A recommended fee of \$100.00 is collected by the funeral directors and forwarded on to church. Families wishing to provide a stipend to Father should instruct the funeral director as to the amount to be given.

Non parishioners

It is the policy of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs to charge an additional stole fee of \$100.00 for the funeral service of a non-parishioner. Families wishing to provide a stipend to Father should instruct the funeral director as to the amount to be given.

FUNERAL LUNCH

Parishioners

It is the custom of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs that the CCW/Christian Mothers members provide a funeral lunch at no charge after each funeral service held at the parish for a parish member. The members of this organization will provide cake and jello, as well as prepare and serve any other items that the family of the deceased asks and pays for.

Non parishioners


If a lunch is to be provided there is a \$1.00 per plate (\$150 minimum) for the CCW/Christian mothers to prepare and serve the meal. This is in addition to the cost of the ingredients for the meal. The members of this organization will provide cake and jello, as well as prepare and serve any other items that the family of the deceased asks and pays for.

Cemetery Rules & Regulations

In accordance with the Diocese of New Ulm Cemetery Regulations these cemetery rules are published and will serve as supplemental operational regulations to diocesan regulations for Japanese Martyrs Catholic Cemetery in Leavenworth, Minnesota.

- No plants, flower arrangements or metal flag stands shall be placed before May 15th. All artificial flower arrangements, flags, lights, and other decorative items that are not attached to the stones or in permanent planters must be removed by October 15th.
 Note: Structured rule is 7/days after an event of the deceased, to allow extra foliage and plants by graves.
- 2. Permission must be obtained before any monument, marker, or permanent display can be set in Japanese Martyrs Cemetery. Permission obtained from Cemetery Committee.
- 3. Foot Markers and Veteran's Markers are allowed at the foot end of said grave.
- 4. The burial of cremains is allowed in Japanese Martyrs Cemetery according to the New Ulm Diocese Policies. For specifics, check with Cemetery Committee member.
- 5. Concerning a cremation on an occupied lot, the marker should be placed at the foot of the plot with the urn adjacent to or under the foot stone.
- 6. All markers and monuments must have a 4" reinforced concrete apron.

- 7. No spraying allowed, no private mowing, planting or trimming allowed on family grave spaces.
- 8. Repairs of monuments or markers are the responsibility of the current lot owner or family member. If the current lot owner is unknown or they are unable to be located, the Japanese Martyrs Cemetery Committee will consider repairs of a monument or marker.
- 9. Shepherd hooks or wind chimes allowed if placed next to base and angled toward stone. See drawing. Questions contact Cemetery Committee Members.

WEDDING POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs to follow the guidelines and wedding policies of the Diocese of New Ulm. The custom at Catholic parishes is that a stole fee shall be given to the parish when a wedding takes place at the Church of the Japanese Martyrs. The fee for a wedding is \$250.00 for couples who belong to the AFC and \$500.00 for non-members, paid in advance.

COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN/CHRISTIAN MOTHER'S SOCIETY

CCW/CHRISTIAN MOTHERS DUTIES & EVENTS

According to the CCW/Christian Mothers bylaws, the members of the organization are asked to help with Funeral Luncheons and the general cleaning of the Church and the Religious Education Centers.

Funeral Luncheon: The CCW constitution and by-laws state that circles will prepare and serve a luncheon for all funerals held at the Church of the Japanese Martyrs. Each circle taking a turn. The family of the deceased decides the menu. The members of the circle will donate cake and/or jello. The family furnishes all other food. Any monies donated at funerals will be placed in the CCW treasury to be used for future needs of the church. If you are unable to help, you must get a substitute, and pay them \$10.00 and you must provide the food asked for.

Annual Church Cleaning: Circles will be assigned each year to clean the church and the church hall prior to and after the annual church dinner in July. If a member of the assigned circle cannot work they are asked to find a substitute whom they are to pay \$10.00. The circle chairs are asked to post the date and time and to purchase the cleaning supplies if necessary. A list of areas to clean and what to do should also be posted.

Honorary CCW: Those ladies over age 65 or are incapacitated at a younger age has a choice to become an honorary member of the CCW by contacting the CCW President. They are asked to pay the membership dues, but are excused from church cleaning, working at funerals, etc. They are welcome to donate cake, jello and help as they choose. They are not required or obligated to get a substitute. These ladies will not be called upon by the chairladies of the circle to which they belong.

College CCW Members: Those CCW members attending college, or have moved away, but are still members of the Church of the Japanese Martyrs, are to pay the yearly dues of \$5.00 and are to participate in circle activities whenever possible. (Circle by-laws Article A, Section 1)

World Day of Prayer: Mary Lou Mathiowetz takes care of this event and asks for volunteers, as well.

Annual Anointing Mass: The Service Commission coordinator is asked to arrange helpers to provide a luncheon after the annual Anointing Mass scheduled at Japanese Martyrs.

Annual Confirmation Reception: The sophomore class and their parents are asked to provide a reception for the juniors after the parish confirmation mass. The DRE will contact sophomore class parents.

Mission Quilts: The **Service Commission** will schedule and coordinate an annual gathering to sew quilts for the missions.

Circle Bake Sales: Each year the circles are asked to hold a Fall and a Spring Bake Sale. Each CCW member is asked to donate at least \$2.50 worth of baked goods or cash. All proceeds go to the CCW Treasurer.

Japanese Martyrs Religious Education Program

The religious education program is a combined program between The Church of the Japanese Martyrs, Leavenworth and St. Paul's Catholic Church, Comfrey. The goal of the program is to educate our youth toward a better understanding of the teaching of Jesus and traditions of the Church. Sacramental preparation of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation are included.

The program is divided into four classes, each on tailored to reach children in different age groups. Classes meet on a weekly basis on Wednesday evenings, and additional meetings are conducted throughout the year for parents preparing their children for the Sacraments. The most important religious education, however, is for the parents and children to celebrate weekend Mass together as a family.
