Life is beautiful and, at times, heart-
 breaking. The world has watched in
 horror as the people of Ukraine have
 been persecuted relentlessly this past
 year. Only 60 years ago this month we
 survived the Cuban Missile Crisis, a
 standoff between the United States and
 the former Soviet Union. Decades later,

history has apparently repeated itself, largely attributed to the
 immense ego of one man in the Kremlin.

It may be a good time to review what Catholicism teaches with
 regards to legitimate self-defense, even if these methods of
 defense include lethal means. Our faith teaches us that there is
 a big difference between murder (terminating the life of an
 innocent person) and lethal self-defense (terminating the life of
 an "unjust aggressor"). The Catechism of the Catholic Church
 underscores that when a person, family, or sovereign country is
 attacked by one seeking to inflict real harm we have both the
 "right and the duty" to defend ourselves, even if this defense
 includes the termination of the "unjust aggressor's" life (CCC,
 nos. 2265, 2321). As one can imagine, this issue frequently
 arises for soldiers, police, and military members, charged with
 possibly dropping bombs or terminating the life of an opposing
 'aggressor' with nefarious intentions. Thus, to terminate the life
 of the other (aggressor) or render them unable to inflict harm is
 considered by the Catholic Church as both a "right and a duty"
 for those charged to defend others (e.g., spouse, children, one's
 country) and even for justifiable self-defense. It is, therefore,
 not a sin to kill an "unjust aggressor" if he intends on inflicting
 lethal harm on us, our family, or country. Another way of saying
 this is if someone is breaking in your home at 2am, we do what
 we have to do to defend ourselves. While we love our city,
 Memphis is often a dangerous place to live. It is prudent to be
 ready and alert should we ever find ourselves in this situation.

On Thursday, November 17th from 6pm-8pm we will have a
 communal prayer service for the people of Ukraine here at
 St. Michael's Church. People often say to their priests, "I wish
 there was something we could do for the people in Ukraine."
 Here is something we can do, especially in the week before we
 celebrate Thanksgiving Day in this country. At this prayer
 service we will have Eucharistic adoration, a bilingual rosary, a
 Eucharistic procession, and confessions. Please make plans to
 bring your families to pray for these people in such horrible
 situations in this persecuted country.

We each have the "right and duty" to defend ourselves against
 those with evil intent, whether that is from an intruder or an au-
 tocrat sitting in the Kremlin. Let's come together to pray for our
 brothers and sisters in Ukraine at this difficult time for them.
