



#### READINGS FOR THE 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 9, 2022

The Gospel recalls the healing of the ten lepers, including the one who returned to give thanks to God. As we prepare to be nourished in word and in sacrament, let us gather before the Lord with grateful hearts seeking mercy and pardon for our sins.

The readings from 2 Kings and the Gospel have three features.

- 1) The dreaded disease of leprosy, for which there was no cure and which excluded one from the community, is miraculously cured.
- 2) Both Naaman, and the leper who returned to Jesus
- were foreigners, that is, outside of Judaism. Thus we see here the salvation of God reaching out beyond the confines of Israel.
- 3) Both of these foreigners expressed gratitude and began immediately to worship the true God. This is in striking contrast to the "other nine" who were already within the fold. We see here the spontaneous gratitude

of those who receive the gift of God unexpectedly. You are healed because you believe. All the nations will know you and praise you.

#### 2 Kings 5:14-17

Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel.

Under what circumstances and in what situations have you come to experience the presence of God?

#### 2 Timothy 2:8-13

If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself.



Have you experienced the blessing of God even though you were much aware of having broken faith? Recall that event.

#### Luke 17:11-19 Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.

To who have you been sent to witness your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ?

#### Gratitude on the road to eternal salvation!

Next Sunday's Gospel is the one that is always used for Mass on Thanksgiving Day in the United States. It speaks of the foundational attitude that opens us up to the grace of God in an on-going and saving way: gratitude. The Greek word that is used to describe the Mass, "Eucharist," means "thanksgiving" and "gratitude."

Next Sunday's Gospel is the scene in the Gospel of Luke where ten lepers see Jesus from a long distance away as he and his disciples were at the edge of a village. They cried out a word of faith, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us" (Luke 17:13). Jesus then tells them to begin going back into town to the priests who would examine them to see if they were free enough from the contagious disease of leprosy to be able to participate again in the community's worship gatherings. After realizing that they were healed, only one returned to thank Jesus. Because of that expression of gratitude and thanksgiving, Jesus declares that this Samaritan leper is saved!

The grateful Samaritan man expresses three key aspects

for the road to eternal salvation. First, he <u>expressed faith</u> that Jesus was the One who could save/heal him. Secondly, he obeyed Jesus' request and <u>put his faith into action</u> that he would be healed and started going to the priests even before the healing was complete. And, finally, the Samaritan man <u>expressed gratitude</u> for Jesus' healing mercy.

In the First Reading, from 2 Kings 5, the army commander of a neighboring country – and sometimes rival – asked the prophet Elisha for prayer for healing from leprosy. Elisha responded by asking the army commander, Naaman, to express an act of both faith and obedience. Elisha asked Naaman to go to the Jordan River and bathe there seven times. This seemed usual to Naaman. He figured that he would be "zapped" by Elisha and be healed by him by simply laying hands on him. Naaman's faith and obedience, however, proved effective when he responded by washing in the Jordan River at the prompting of a Jewish girl in their camp.

<u>Faith</u>, <u>active obedience</u> and <u>gratitude</u> are all interior dynamics that are essential to healing. Someone who is

seeking freedom from an addiction would find these qualities as helping them to respond to the treatment plans and support that are available for them for healing. May faith, obedience, and gratitude help not only those in need of healing but also help us all who are on the road to on-going freedom and eternal salvation!!

#### **Pastor's Letter**

Thank you, again, to Sr. Sharon for organizing the Mass of Anointing last week and to all who both decorated and provided foods for the social time afterward. It seemed like a good opportunity for so many of our parishioners to be encouraged through the social and spiritual burdens that can be part of both acute and chronic conditions.

Again, please note that this is a "Confirmation Year" and so please contact the parish office now if you have a 5th or 6th grader – or older – so that we can have accurate numbers of resources for the participants. We have submitted a request for several possible dates in the Spring after Easter, and we will let you know when that date gets established. Some of our older students – in high school – might be participating with our RCIA group, which will likewise be beginning this week, on Thursday, October 6th, with a potluck dinner at 6:30 p.m.

It's not too late to participate with our RCIA group – Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. We are always in need of team members and if you would like a refresher of our Catholic Faith, this is a good review of the essentials of our faith.

There are three basic steps of RCIA and the first step the "Inquiry Stage" will be during October and November, when we take a general overview of our beliefs and practices as a whole. So, prospective participants who simply want an overview might enjoy these sessions.

Then, from December until Easter is the catechumen or candidate stage. That's when we take the topics of faith in more detail. Others who would like that kind of refresher of our Faith are welcome to participate at that time, too.

I'm looking forward to participating in a Mass at Bishop Rosecrans High School this upcoming Friday, October 7th. Our whole St. Benedict School will journey over there to participate in the Mass, which is now called the Partner School Mass. This includes other area schools such as Bishop Fenwick and Bishop Rosecrans High.

The annual Blessing of the Animals is scheduled for this week, too, on Tuesday, October 4th, at 2:00 p.m., which is on the annual feast of St. Francis. We are planning to open the "courtyard parking lot" especially for parents and guardians of our St. Benedict School students. All parishioners are welcome to participate, too, but please contact the school office [(740) 432-6751] so that we can anticipate your participation.

May Our Lord Jesus Christ help us to experience the transforming power of His mercy as He helps us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!
