### Great Ideas for Living the Faith at St. Gabriel Parish

- The **Living Rosary** is held each year. This year, bring the family to church on *Saturday, October 19 at 1 p.m.* and participate in praying the rosary where humans make up each of the prayer beads. Hear the Hail Mary prayed in different languages, and be a part of praying one of the most treasured prayers of our faith.
- At the **7 p.m. All Saints Day Mass on November 1**, children are invited to dress as a saint and join in the entrance procession. This is a great way to introduce children to some of the great heroes of our faith.
- Attending Mass is the first and most important thing we do as Catholics. To help children grow in their role as participants in the liturgy, each class helps host a youth Mass. **All children from both Sunday and Wednesday classes are expected to participate in a ministry on the Sunday their grade(s) hosts Mass.** Please take note of the Sunday your child is scheduled to participate. Your child's catechist will send home notes a few weeks beforehand with the child's ministry listed. Please arrive and check in with your child's catechist at 10:30 a.m. on youth Mass day, so that last-minute directions can be given.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

In teaching our youth about our Catholic Faith, we have been called to a ministry. A ministry that embodies the mission of Christ in caring for our youth and caring for one another. We have not only been called to teach our youth about our Catholic faith but to do so in a space that is a safe, and a space that allows our youth to form a relationship with God.

As a result the Archdiocese of Seattle would like to take this opportunity to educate our youth and give them the tools they need to protect themselves from those who may harm them. In creating a safe space for our youth, we can teach and show them the ways of Christ in a safe environment conducive to learning. Keeping our minors and vulnerable adult's safe starts with you.

This Winter/Spring St. Gabriel parish will provide one sexual abuse prevention course to your youth. This lesson has been integrated into the religious task and essential concepts taught within Faith Formation as to seem as natural as possible while being most effective for our youth in the context of abuse prevention.

Please understand that your child is being given a lesson about sexual abuse prevention, not sex education. While these topics do have similar names, they are completely different subject matter. **Sexual abuse prevention** courses teach and give our youth the tools they need to protect themselves from those who may try to harm them. **Sex Education** is curriculum designed to examine issues relating to human sexuality, including relations, responsibility, sexual anatomy, sexual activity, reproduction, etc.
