9:30AM Sunday mass averaged 118 attendees  
11:30AM Sunday mass averaged 311 attendees  
1PM Sunday mass averaged 191 attendees

### **Average mass counts for Fiscal Year 2024-2025:**

4:30PM Saturday was eliminated  
9:30AM Sunday mass became 9AM mass averaged 142 attendees  
11:30AM Sunday mass became 11AM mass averaged 323 attendees  
1PM Sunday mass averaged 233 attendees

Overall, there was an increase of 26% in mass attendance at Prince of Peace.

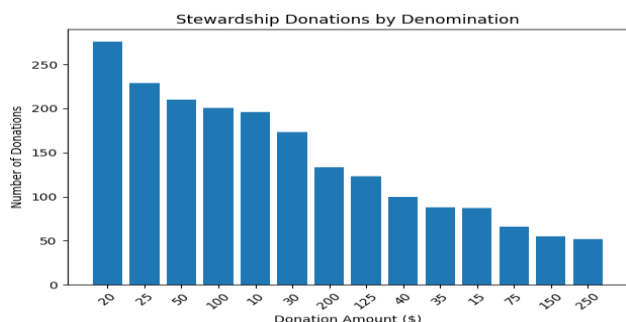

## *Looking Back with Gratitude: 2023–2024*

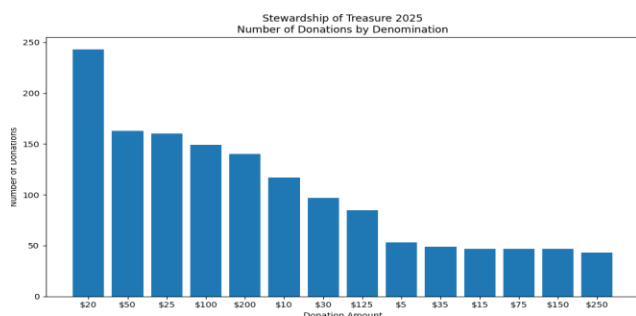


Many parishioners shared their gifts of \$20, \$25, \$50, and \$100. These offerings remind us that stewardship is not about the size of a gift, but about faithful participation.

Frequent smaller gifts showed a spirit of weekly generosity, as parishioners responded to God's blessings in their daily lives.

Larger gifts reflected the generosity of those who felt called to give more in that season, helping support the mission and ministries of our parish. Together, these gifts formed a strong foundation that allowed our parish to serve, worship, and grow.

## *Moving Forward with Intention: 2024–2025*



In 2024–2025, parishioners continued to give faithfully, again most often through \$20, \$25, \$50, and \$100 gifts.

While there were fewer total gifts, many families gave more intentionally and consistently, reflecting prayerful discernment.

Strong participation at \$125 and \$200 levels shows that many households are embracing stewardship as a way of life, not just a weekly habit.

This year reflects a deepening understanding that stewardship is a response to God's love—giving first to God, not from what is left over.

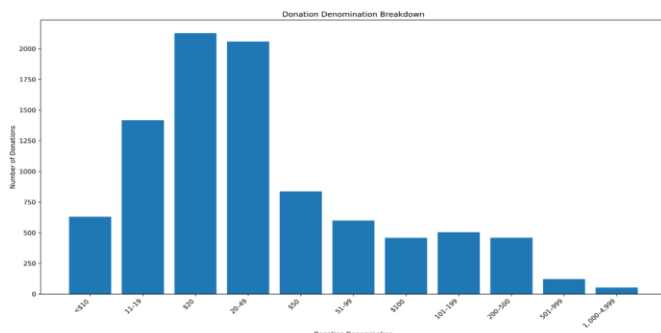

# Stewardship St. Gabriel

## *Looking Back with Gratitude: 2023–2024*



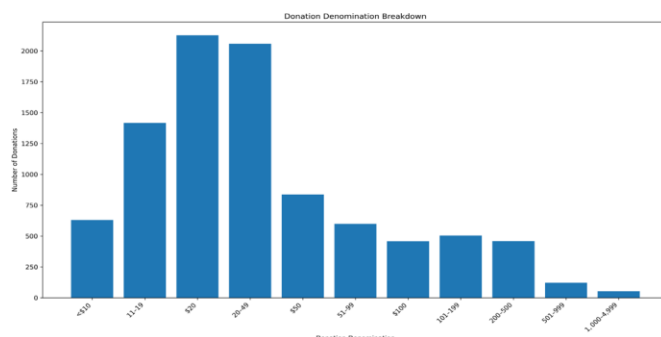
The largest concentration of gifts falls between \$20–\$49, reflecting broad, consistent participation across the parish.

A strong base of modest gifts (under \$20) highlights widespread engagement and accessibility to giving.

Gifts of \$100 and above, while fewer in number, represent meaningful leadership generosity that supports long-term parish stability.

Very large gifts are rare but impactful, underscoring the importance of every gift at every level.

## *Moving Forward with Intention: 2024–2025*



Total giving participation declined modestly in Fiscal Year 2024–2025, reflecting fewer gifts across most denomination levels rather than a collapse in any single category.

Gifts under \$10 declined noticeably (from 954 to 631), suggesting fewer very small, occasional gifts.

The \$11–\$19 range remained relatively strong, reinforcing that many parishioners continue to give at accessible levels.

The \$20–\$49 range remains the strongest participation tier. Gifts in the \$50 and \$51–\$99 ranges increased slightly or held steady, indicating modest growth in intentional giving.

The \$101–\$199 category increased, suggesting some donors are moving upward in generosity. This points to donor maturation, not donor loss.
