Keep Christ in Christmas Family Advent Activities *the ultimate Advent activity list for families*

Serving others:

1. Shop for a gift to put under the Tree of Joy (or another charity).
2. Fill a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child.
3. Visit an elderly home and hand out homemade cookies.
4. Take a few small gifts to a shelter for women and children.
5. Write a letter to a family friend or some troops stationed overseas.

Faith-based activities:

1. Visit a "live" nativity scene.
2. Go to a candlelight church service.
3. Read the Christmas story in the Bible.
4. Make and decorate a birthday cake for Jesus.
5. Spend time on your bellies playing with the family nativity scene and acting out the story.
6. Cut your lunch sandwiches into the shape of stars and talk about the original Christmas star.
7. Write a letter to Jesus, thanking him for the gifts you received throughout the year.
8. Attend Christmas Eve Mass at a beautiful cathedral.
9. Make a manger with twigs you collect from outside and talk about Baby Jesus and the type of place he was born into.
10. Make paper crowns and talk about the wise men and the gifts they brought Jesus.
11. Visit a local farm and talk about what it must have been like for Mary and Joseph to have a baby in a stable.
12. Read one story from the Jesus Storybook Bible each day starting December 1st.
13. Use "The Truth in the Tinsel" – an Advent experience for little hands.
14. Use "What God Wants for Christmas" – Christmas in their hands, in their hearts, and out of the box.
