



Good Shepherd Sunday



he deeply personal union between God and humanity is described in this Sunday's reading from the Gospel of St. John (10:27-30). The metaphor of a shepherd who intimately knows his sheep describes the close relationship we have with Jesus. God the Father and God the Son are one, and thus, the Divine knows us and draws us into an eternal union. God truly gets us, but how do we get to know God? Saint Francis de Sales reminds us in his Treatise on the Love of God (1616) that through prayer, the intimate "heart to heart" communication between the individual person and God is fostered. The closest of friends or lovers know each other - their thoughts, their (re)actions; likewise, humanity and God can be just as close through prayer.
