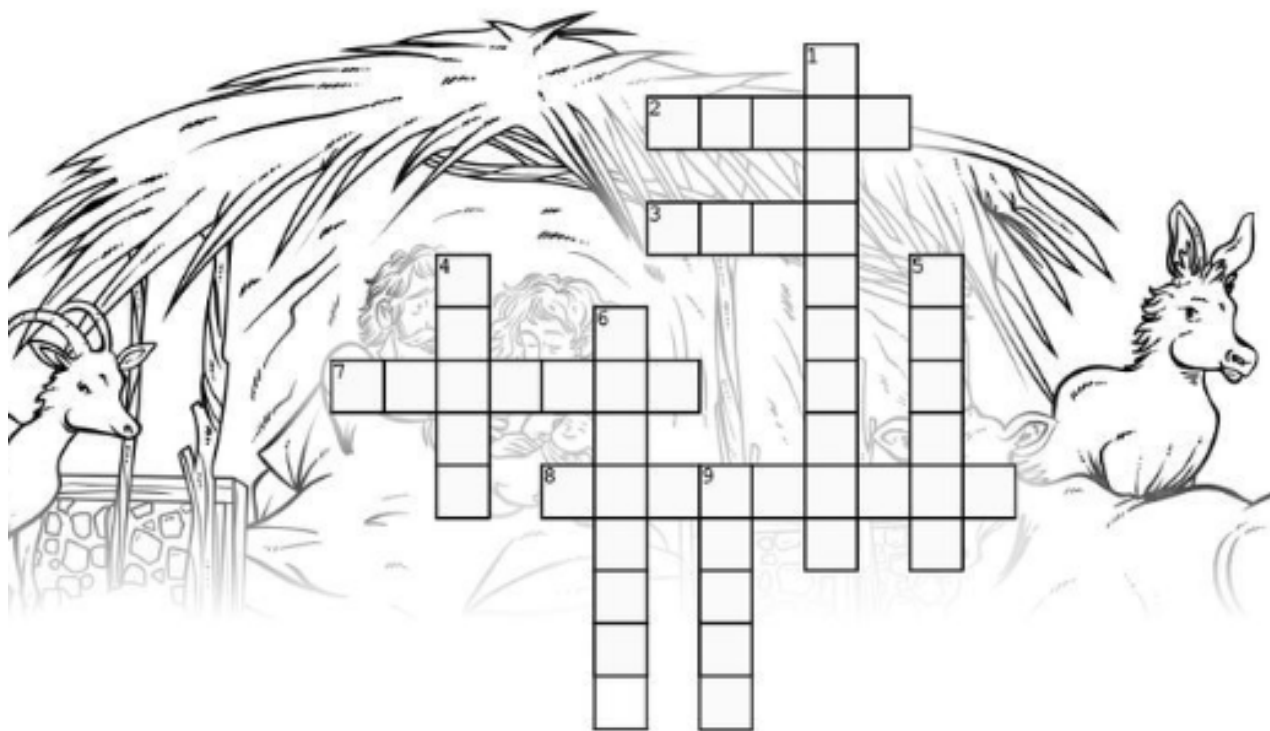


Liturgical Moment - The Epiphany of the Lord

While the hustle and bustle of Christmas ends for many people on Dec. 26, throughout Christian history Christmas lasts for **twelve days** – all the way until Jan. 6. This feast marking the end of Christmas is called “Epiphany.”

In the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus was the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but also in his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana.
