

## Quarterly Thoughts From The Corner Office!

Dear friends,






## 2020 Lenten Theme

## FINANCE CORNER

#### A LOOK BACK... TRANSFIGURATION'S CMA HISTORY

The Church of the Transfiguration has existed for 37 years in 2020. We have made significant contributions over the years to the Diocesan Catholic Ministries Appeal.

We all know about the CMA – the appeal launches in the Fall of every year – when we receive a mailing from our Bishop and Pastor – information is shared on what the CMA supports (and what it doesn't). The appeal closes on May 31 the following year.

The Diocese is our predominate connection to the Universal Catholic Church. Our faith is rich in history and dates back to the first apostles of the church – initially led by Saint Peter – the Catholic Church's first leader – the Church founded by Jesus himself.

This connection to our Diocese is manifested by our parish's participation in the CMA. Transfiguration has a strong history of meeting our CMA goal – and sometimes surpassing it. Did you know that half of any amount we collect over our goal comes back to Transfiguration? This has occurred for several years in the past.

Here's a look back on Transfiguration's participation – since 2011:

Another thing to mention is that we have a history of meeting the goal in an early timeframe. Between 2011 and 2017 we attained our CMA goal before Dec 31st of the previous year.

What about this year? As this article is being submitted for the Q1 2020 newsletter printing, we are at roughly \$182,000, over \$21,000 short of our goal.

As most of us are aware, if we do not meet our goal, the difference must be made up out of Parish Savings –the same account that we have the goal of building up with planned savings in our current budget.

If you haven't yet contributed to the CMA, can you consider a gift this year? Even a small gift is appreciated. We'd really like to have a higher participation rate amongst parishioners. To date, 28% (395 donors) of Transfiguration's registered parishioners have contributed to this year's campaign.
