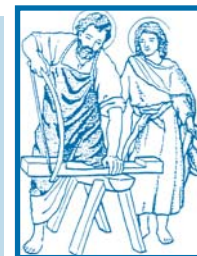

Who is St. John Vianney?

Jean-Baptiste-Marie **Vianney**, (8 May 1786 – 4 August 1859), was a French parish priest.

He is most notably known for his simplicity, time spent in the confessional, conversions and battles with the devil.

His work as a confessor is his most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God's people. Even the few hours he would allow himself for sleep were disturbed frequently by the devil.

Who, but a man with vision, could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide. Feast day-August 4.


