We thank him for his superior motivation, wellness support, and great ideas, and wish him well on the next phase of his career in education.

Warm Weather School Attire

As the temperatures rise and the classrooms warm up, we want the students to dress comfortably yet appropriately. Since we have not been enforcing the uniform policy this year, we will allow students to be "out of uniform" for the remainder of the year, but will still enforce the knee-length rule for shorts or skirts, proper footwear with closed toe and heel straps, and modest-fitting clothing. 2020-21 Annual School Status Report St. Gregory the Great Parish School

Mission/philosophy/goals- The current school improvement plan in mission and Catholic identity has been to increase staff participation and role modeling of Catholic Social Teachings in our school community and provide opportunities for faculty and students to learn, reflect, and take action as Catholic participants in global discipleship.

• Explore opportunities for students and staff to participate in action projects within the community.

- Re-establish our Catholic commitment to service and volunteerism
- Fine tune service expectations for our graduates

Due to the pandemic, this goal has lost some of its momentum this year. However, the staff participated in 2 retreats, our students participated in the Rice Bowl program, and individual classrooms completed simple service projects with their students such as cards for veterans, artwork for the pantry patrons, letters to soldiers, and letters to home bound parishioners.

We will continue to work towards this goal next year as the pandemic ends and more opportunities become available. We would like to renew our Exemplary status in School Mission and Catholic Identity in 2023.

Overview of the curricular program- The past two years we have been focusing on the goal to update technology infrastructure and design curriculum and instruction that prepares students to become expert users of technology within the classroom.

- Transition to school-wide student use of Chromebooks
- Become a Google-certified school- increase education technology literacy across the board
- Provide training for teachers to utilize and incorporate more technology into the learning process

One of the benefits of the pandemic was that we were forced into the realm of technology in a way that we would have never imagined. Our staff and students had to quickly learn how to become expert users of technology and everyone rose to the challenge. We now have school-wide 1:1 Chromebook access. The school owns 4 classroom sets of Chromebooks, and we were able to obtain 6 more classroom sets with our Esser funds this year. Each set came complete with charging carts. Some Google training was offered to the middle school teachers this year, but most of the learning was self-taught in the moment of teaching. Next year we will provide more training to seek Google certification.

Last year we established the goal to improve student Math RIT scores to reflect a 1.5 year growth in 1 year's time in 60% of our students.

- Implement Daily 3 instruction format
- Adopt the latest math series across all grade levels (2019)

- Training for teachers in Daily 3 instruction and best practices
- Develop tracking system for individual student growth

With the adoption of our new math series for all grades in 2019, we were off to a great start in providing training in Daily 3 instruction for our teachers and providing guided instruction for our students. We were seeing a slight increase in our student MAP math scores from fall to winter, but then the pandemic struck, and we were no longer able to test students to track student growth. We have not been able to MAP test this year at all, so we hope to resume our tracking next year. Thankfully, our goal to fully implement a school-wide Standards-Based Grading method of assessment was met the year before the pandemic hit. We had established the framework with the students and families in 2018-19. Each year since, we have further aligned our objectives and assessments with the standards

and provided more opportunities for our students to be involved in the assessment process. By identifying priority standards for each subject area at each grade level, we are better able to determine what students must learn before moving to the next grade.

- Provide communication to parents and students
- Make policy updates in handbooks i.e.: homework policy, grade reporting
- Provide professional development of the best assessment practices for teachers
- Update grading and reporting systems- PowerSchool and report cards

All these tasks were completed. We are now implementing scoring guides and assessment strategies to further support the goal.

General curriculum- We had hoped to adopt a new Social Studies series this year, as our current one is from 2013. New state SS standards were recently adopted and have shifted the instructional focus from content to skill-based with an emphasis on inquiry. As the pandemic required us to modify our curriculum to accommodate a virtual setting, we felt that it was best to wait another year to adopt a new series. We are currently in the process of reviewing resource options for next year.

I must commend our teachers for their dedication, professionalism, flexibility, and perseverance in the implementation of our virtual and hybrid learning formats. Their tremendous efforts and rapid skill development provided smooth transitions and effective accommodations for our students.

Achievement test results- Our students have not participated in our diagnostic or growth measurement testing of MAP this year. Grades 3-8 participated in the state Forward Exam. Results are not released until mid-July.

Goals- The School Commission developed a new marketing plan to incur an 11% increase in enrollment in early childhood over a 3-year period.

Status of accreditation- We were fully accredited this year. We are currently in year 3 of the 7-year cycle. Each school receives an accreditation visit every 7 years.

Financial status and projections- Our enrollment was lower than anticipated this year due mainly to the pandemic. We also graduated a class of 28 and took in a class of 7. We hope to enroll a minimum of 150 choice and 10 tuition students.

Tuition and fees- see tuition schedule

Parish subsidy and other funding streams- The school received Esser Funds this year as part of the pandemic relief support for schools. The archdiocese gave us a \$1000.00 in the form of a COVID-19 relief grant. In addition, Title funds were used to provide PD, learning materials, and start-up funds for our school garden.

Parent engagement initiatives, including parent education, extra-curricular activities, and volunteerism - It becomes increasingly difficult to engage parents in volunteering for these roles within the school. This year we did not have much parent interaction, but the Home and School and School Commission are challenged with finding committed, skilled, and willing parents to support extra-curricular and/or leadership positions. Therefore, the following goal was established:

Leadership groups engage in formation, ongoing training, and self-evaluation for themselves to ensure the faithful execution of their respective responsibilities.

- Develop evaluation tools to aid in defining and evaluating the effectiveness of leadership groups
- Ensure understanding of specific membership responsibility
- Provide training to improve leadership quality

Our school commission was blessed to receive training from Mr. Bruce Varich, Associate Superintendent for the Office of Schools, in order to establish an effective team. We were able to accomplish these three tasks for the current School Commission; however, the terms of several of our commission members will be up after the next school year. Recruiting new members and providing the ongoing training is always a challenge.

Recognition of accomplishments of students- The students of St. Greg's have demonstrated tremendous adaptability and perseverance throughout the school year as we transitioned through virtual and hybrid learning settings. They developed vital technology skills, time management, and independence in their learning.

Recognition of professional accomplishments of teachers/staff/administrator-

- -Lisa Bayer (5th gr. Teacher) is retiring after 27 years of teaching in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, and 25 of those years were served here at St. Gregory the Great. -Katie Hayes (5K teacher) is pursuing her special education degree to add to her early childhood degree.
- Recommendations to strengthen the quality of the school program- Continue to strengthen the bridge between the parish and the school. Combining efforts of marketing and recruitment. Providing opportunities for families and youth to participate in parish and school events.

Report on facility usage, maintenance, and projections of future needs- An ongoing goal has been to increase the safety and security measures of our school building

- Establish, implement, and enforce building security procedures and protocols
- Install more security cameras to increase surveillance of interior and exterior of building
- Install double lock features on all school entrances
- Install security door between main school entrance and Tenpenny Hall vestibule
- Obtain financing through DOJ security egrant to support upgrades
- Provide staff training in crisis prevention and response

The security grant was completed this school year. All the listed goals were completed except the security door in the hall vestibule. The door is no longer considered a priority. However, continued communication with outside parties who use the school facility must be maintained to ensure building safety and security.

- -One more security camera placed facing the steps of door #10 would provide added surveillance of a "popular loitering spot" for our teenage neighbors.
- -The gym floor was resurfaced, the 1st floor was replaced, and a new roof was surfaced over the 4K and Bookends building.
- -Expenses for Cleaning and safety precautions were taken on this year to accommodate for the pandemic.
- -Consideration for window replacement throughout the school building is still in effect.
