THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

BRING IN YOUR OLD PALMS: We will be collecting old palms beginning this weekend until Sunday, February 20th. Place them in the basket on the table in the Gatherina Space. It is important to remember that because the palms have been blessed, they are now considered to be sacramentals in the eyes of the Church and should be disposed of reverently. We will burn them for ashes for Ash Wednesday.

Saint Valentine's Day: Monday, February 14th

Tomorrow is the Feast of St. Valentine's Day a time when many remember friends and loved ones in a special way. Our knowledge of the life of Saint Valentine has been lost to history, but most people agree that he is the patron of love, of friendship, and of happy marriages.

Some stories say that this Third Century Saint presided over the marriages of many Christian couples in ceremonies that were done in secret because of religious persecutions. Others tell of the time that he was imprisoned because he would not renounce his Faith and healed the jailer's blind daughter, leaving her a note on the day of his execution that said, "From your Valentine".

What then is the takeaway for us as Christians? Regardless of the details of St. Valentine's life, he was one of many who valued Christ's love even above their own lives, and that, in and of itself, is something to commemorate and to appreciate. Besides sending special greetings, or giving candy or flowers or gifts to others on this day, here are some other ways that you might celebrate St. Valentine's Day:

Read Bible Passages: As a way to prepare spend time with passages from Scripture that speak of God's love. Some suggestions to get you started:

Micah 7: 18-19 Romans 8: 38-39

2 Corinthians 13: 11-12

1 John 4-7

- Make a Valentine card or a "Valentine List for God" giving thanks and praise to God for all God has given you. You can share it with family members at mealtime, or at another time during the day, or simply share it with God.
- Write letters and make valentines: Set aside time for everyone (including moms and dads and other adults) to write a letter to another member of the family or to someone else. The letter can be simple, two-or three-lines, or more involved. You can use stickers and craft materials for decorating them. The important thing is to say "I care about you" in some way. Send the letter, or e-mail/text a photo of it, on Valentine's Day.
- Decorate a place in your house with a quote about love from the Scriptures or from the Saints. (Better yet, if you have older children have them find quotes and make the decorations.)
- Make it a day for hugs! Encourage hugs all around (but only with immediate family members. Safety first!)
- Start the day with an Act of Love Prayer: The Act of Love is a traditional prayer that goes like this: "O Lord God, I love you above all things, and I love my neighbor for your sake because you are worthy of my love. For your love, I give you thanks. Amen." If this feels too formal, make your own Act of Love. Either way, it's a reminder that love has its origins in God.

On this St. Valentine Weekend, may you and your loved ones stay safe and well, be richly blessed, and know that God loves and cares for you.



Dear Padre,

It seems one news story after another has reported a priest, bishop, or other person associated with the Church abusing a child. Why should I remain in the Catholic Church?

Understandably, many Catholics have fallen into anger and despair, thinking their leaders were reprehensible hypocrites. But it's not unprecedented that some bishops, priests, and even popes have done bad

things. Recall that Peter denied Jesus, and yet he became the first pope. We also recall that, except for John, all the apostles abandoned Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Scripture describes the Church as "the bride of Christ." Paul said the Church is the bride for whom Christ sacrificed himself and "handed himself over for her" (Ephesians 5:25). Revelation describes



the Church at the end of time "prepared as a bride adorned for her husband" (Revelation 21:2). Like a groom or bride loves a spouse—faults and all—Christ loves his bride, the Church.

Matrimony is a sacrament designed by Christ, placing a man and woman amid society, committed exclusively to each other. As an example, it shows the world how Christ also loves his Church—even with its imperfections. Clearly, multiple groups claiming to be the church Jesus founded cannot be that true Church. That would make Jesus a bigamist! Only our Church traces its succession of leaders back to the original apostles.

That some leaders have been unfaithful doesn't mean the Church as a whole is unfaithful. Like a bride and groom pledging fidelity to each other on their wedding day, we should remain faithful to Christ and his Church.
