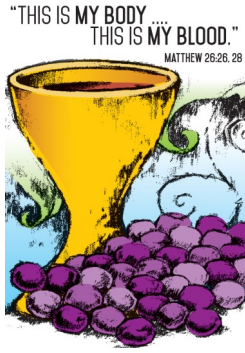

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



Mark 14:12-16,22-26: Today's Gospel tells the story of the Last Supper, the first time Jesus gave us the gift of his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. Among the many glorious feast days of our Catholic faith, Corpus Christi, the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, is one of the richest because of what we are celebrating. Central to the feast is the call to Catholics to express love of the Eucharist to the world, to "proclaim on the housetops" (Mt 10:27) what the apostles came to know at the Last Supper.

Catholics believe in the concept of "transubstantiation". That is, that while the bread and wine continue to have all the appearances of bread and wine (color, shape, taste, calories, gluten etc.) at the Consecration during the Mass their substance is changed completely to actually be Christ's body and Christ's blood."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that just as food gives strength to the body, the Eucharist gives strength to the soul. Through the reception of Holy Communion, the Christian receives the grace to resist temptation and the strength to act with love. Additionally, the Eucharist unites the whole Christian family with Christ.

Jesus is truly with us and truly present in every tabernacle in each Catholic church in the world. At every Mass, we remember and celebrate again what Jesus did for us, what Jesus gave us and what Jesus calls us to do and to be. This weekend we can all rejoice in the extraordinary gift, the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. Happy Feast of Corpus Christi!

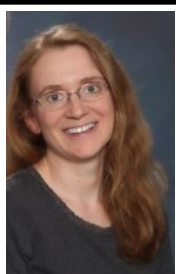


Men of Christ Summer Schedule: We will be meeting at the CLC-
