

CATHOLIC COMEBACK FINAL UPDATE:

- In line with the CDC guidelines, masks are not required for fully vaccinated individuals. Please be respectful of other parishioners as the decision to wear and mask or not is a personal one.
- The ribbons have been removed from the pews. There will be a small section in the back of the church on the left side as you enter the church where ribbons will continue to be used for the next several weekends.
- The holy water fonts located at either side of the entrance to church are filled. The water will be replaced each week prior to the weekend Masses.
- Hymnals are back in the pews. Missalettes have been discontinued, but Readings will continue to be printed and be available at the entrance to church. All prayers are in the back of the hymnal.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT CLASSES: Due to COVID-19, all safe environment education training sessions are conducted virtually in accordance with the guidelines laid out in the Catholic Comeback matrix. Participants will register for a session using the same process as an in-person session, and will be emailed the session log-in information 48 hours prior to the session. For those attending Safe Environment Education session: All participants must arrive on time and stay for the entire session. Latecomers will not be admitted and those who leave early will not receive credit for attendance. Safe Environment Education sessions are not appropriate for those under the age of 18 years. Please plan on selecting a session that will allow you to participate without minors present. You will need to complete the online registration for your safe environment education session. If you are having difficulty registering for the session or have questions, please contact the parish office at 920-452-9623 or stjohnev@btsje.org or the Safe Environment Office Administrative Assistant Cynthia Rivera-Garcia at (414) 769-3447. Assistance is available in English and Spanish. Anyone who works with children, including Catechists and volunteers, must attend a Safe Environment session. The class only needs to be taken once.

Summertime Family Faith Activities

When thinking of family fun events during the summer vacation, we often think of activities such as swimming, biking, hiking, traveling and attending or participating in sporting events. Here are a few other options that you may want to consider in the days and weeks to come:



- **Plan an Evening Picnic:** Choose a night with clear skies to enjoy the outdoors. While picnics can be fun in the middle of the day, summer evenings can provide reprieve from heat and sun. Grab a blanket, a picnic basket, and pack some sandwiches along with a cooler of lemonade. Enlist the help of each family member in gathering supplies and preparing a meal. To begin your picnic, pray together. Take the opportunity to thank God for the gift of healthy food, the beauty of Creation, and the joy of family. Bring along a children's Bible and share Scripture stories together after enjoying your meal.
- **Keep a Nature Journal:** Children love making observations of the outdoors at any time of the year, but especially in summer. Start a journal for your child and decorate it with bright, cutout images from a magazine to personalize it. Then, invite your children to explore the outdoors with you. Look for interesting plants, insects, flowers, rocks, and animal life. Bring a magnifying glass and some colored pencils. Show your children how to make observations and draw pictures of what you see, using labels and notes. You will find that this activity not only keeps up academic skills over the summer but also sparks wonderful questions and engaging conversations with your children. Keep your Nature Journal with you as you travel to parks, beaches, and outdoor events throughout the summer and add to it whenever you can! Talk together about how beautiful and diverse Creation is!
- **Create an Outdoor Theatre:** Encourage your children to pick one or two favorite Bible stories to act out, such as the story of Jesus healing the blind man or the story of Jesus walking on water. Older children can write a script so that all participants can play a role and have a few important lines to say. Using a bed sheet or tablecloth, create a stage area with curtains among the trees. Help children find costumes and props, and make invitations. Invite your neighbors and family members for an afternoon or evening of biblical theatre.

Although these are small things they can create lasting memories that will hopefully bring joy to your family and an opportunity to share and celebrate your Catholic Faith.
