


JOIN GOD'S TEAM: Religious Education Volunteers Needed

What Happens at a Baptism?

Baptism is not a small thing. Using such powerful symbols as water, oil, and fire, it is a Sacrament that washes away original sin and its effects. Baptism has meaning on many levels. It is a Sacrament of initiation, cleansing, strengthening, and welcoming. It offers us a new life in which we become the adopted children of God, followers of Christ, and temples in which the Holy Spirit dwells. Baptism leaves a permanent spiritual mark on our soul that makes us holy and opens us to salvation and eternal life with God.




During the Ceremony:

- The words of Baptism, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," are spoken while the water is poured on the one to be baptized. These words reveal that God in the Trinity is both the source of life and our life's goal.
- The newly baptized is anointed with sacred oil to signify that the Holy Spirit dwells within the heart of this new Christian. It's also a sign of being anointed to a mission to live and love as Jesus lived.
- A white garment is given. It reflects that in Baptism we "put on Christ," taking our new and truest identity as a son or daughter of God.
- A baptismal candle, lit from the Easter candle, represents the one true light of Christ, a light to guide the new believer throughout his or her life.

Like other Sacraments, Baptism makes visible an invisible reality. Being present at a Baptism reminds all of us, that we are to respond to Jesus with childlike wonder and faith. Because of what God has done, we can walk in the newness of life in Him forever.
