

#### From Father Schmeckel:

Today, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. In many other parts of the world, this Solemnity is celebrated on January 6 with as much gusto as Christmas Day, but in the United States, the Bishops have moved it to a Sunday to make it easier for most people to attend Mass on this day.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the Epiphany as the "manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the

world." (CCC 528) This feast celebrates three events in one: 1) the adoration of Jesus by the wise men from the East, 2) Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan, and 3) the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus turned water into wine.

In my estimation, for us Christians in the West, the greatness and importance of the Epiphany is often underappreciated. (When I say, 'Christians in the West', this is opposed to Eastern Catholics, Eastern Orthodox, Byzantine Catholics, and many other groups of Catholics and Christians throughout the world who place more emphasis on the Epiphany than Christmas Day.) The Epiphany reminds us that **the coming of Jesus is for the entire world and for every person**. The wise men who come to adore the Infant Jesus are, by all accounts, outsiders. They are not part of the normal and typical 'in' crowd. Thus, their love and adoration for Him brought His saving power far beyond a particular place and time in Israel.

Likewise, when Jesus is baptized and when He changed water into wine, He began to reveal Himself as fully God and to bring His plan of Redemption to the whole world.

As we celebrate the Epiphany this year, we could ask ourselves: **Do we have a burning desire to bring Jesus to every part of the world that we see?** Do we bring Jesus to our workplaces, in our schools, and in our homes by our words, our actions, and our attitude? **Are we convinced and convicted that the message of Jesus and His Gospels brings life and joy?** We pray that the Holy Spirit will give us the gifts of courage and fortitude to be able to be good witnesses of the Gospel wherever we go!

This year, the Baptism of the Lord, celebrated on January 9, marks the end of the liturgical season of Christmas! As we come to the end of this joyous and wonderful season of celebrating the Incarnation of Jesus, I want to again say thank you to everyone whose hard work and dedication helped us to celebrate so well. They include: our sacristans, lectors, ushers, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion; our regular choir, bell choir, children's choir and all musicians; the volunteers who decorate and water extra flowers and plants; our administrative staff and volunteers; our DREs and catechists; our custodial and maintenance staff and volunteers, and many, many others. Thank you for all that you do for our parish! I know that much of your efforts and dedication can sometimes go unnoticed, but I am personally grateful that you help us to bring Jesus to others in ways both big and small. May God reward you for your generosity and kindness!







### Dear Padre,

#### I've been asked to be a godparent. I'm honored but also a little hesitant. What does a godparent have to do?

Congratulations. It is an honor to be a godparent. Hesitancy is appropriate, too, as it is also a responsibility. The Church takes baptism very seriously. As a godparent/sponsor, you represent the larger Catholic community into which the child is being received. Church law requires several qualifications for being a godparent/ sponsor. As a Catholic, you should have been baptized, confirmed, and received the Eucharist. You must be a practicing Catholic and at least sixteen years old (though some dioceses may have other age requirements). You should understand the meaning of baptism and the responsibilities that you will undertake on behalf of the Church.



Parishes often include godparents in the baptismal preparation programs they offer to parents. This baptismal instruction might challenge you to examine your life. The power of your good example cannot be emphasized enough. A child may not understand the behavior of adults, but the child sees their actions. You cannot tell a child to pray if you yourself don't pray.

Don't be scared off by all this. You are being invited to participate in the most important day of this child's life and to continue being involved as the child lives and grows. Don't let it be just a day of pictures and a party. If you let it, this day may change your life, too.
