

From Father Schmeckel:

During the first week of January, I had the opportunity to attend a scripture conference for priests. Our main speakers where: Scott Hahn, John Bergsma, and Tim Gray. All of them are excellent biblical scholars and I would highly recommend any of their videos, lectures, and books as extremely useful in growing in your spiritual life and in your knowledge of Sacred Scripture. The theme for this year's conference was the "journey to holiness" with an emphasis on Matthew's Gospel because we'll be reading from Saint Matthew at Mass on most Sundays this year. Here are a few first takeaways for me that might help you in your own journey to holiness.



In one of Dr. Tim Gray's talks, he said, "Holiness radiates out of the Presence of God." He spoke about the architecture and nature of the Temple as it was described in the Old Testament where it was often called the holy dwelling place of God. The one Temple in Jerusalem made that city holy. As such, the city of Jerusalem is often described as "holy" or is used to foreshadow and describe the "heavenly Jerusalem"; and even beyond that, Israel, the land beyond the city of Jerusalem in which the Presence of God is Israel, which is called the "Holy Land" – even today! And so, being in the presence of God naturally makes things holy.

For us as Christians, what is the easiest way to be in the presence of God? Through the Eucharist, and Mass is the most straightforward way. If we want to grow in holiness, we should try to be in the presence of the Eucharist where God makes Himself present and available to us. We could also make it a habit of stopping by one of our churches during the day to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament for a few moments of silent prayer, and if that is not possible, we could spend a few moments reading the Scriptures each day and making an act of Spiritual Communion, expressing our desire and longing to receive Jesus in Holy Communion. A second takeaway for me from the conference I attended was **the importance of reading in our lives as Christians**. Listening to these great speakers, it was clear to me how important reading Scripture, spiritual reading, and other academic works helped them to grow in their own intellectual and spiritual knowledge of God. The past few times that I have heard Scott Hahn speak, he has mentioned that as he gets older, it's more difficult to read as much or as quickly as he used to. It is a good reminder for us to make spiritual reading and study a part of our lives. Saint Josemaría Escriva said, "Don't neglect your spiritual reading. Reading has made many saints." If we want to grow in holiness, a regular habit of reading can be a way for us to become Saints!

Finally, on a personal note, **I want to say thank you** for the many Christmas greetings, cards, notes, and gifts that you sent me (which I am still making my way through!). Your kindness and generosity mean a lot to me, and I am immensely grateful. Recently, we passed six months of me being your priest at Saint John and Blessed Trinity. I also say thank you for all of the welcome and goodness you've shown me in these first few months together. I know that I've already made many mistakes and left things undone – and plenty more will come, but I am very blessed and grateful to be your priest. Thank you for all of your help and encouragement in so many ways. May God bless you and your families!



Dear Padre,

I am African American. When I go to church, I feel disconnected from the rest of my life. How does the Church fit with my culture?

Church documents lift up different cultures as treasures to be preserved and incorporated into the life of the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "[The gospel] must be proclaimed, celebrated, and lived in all cultures in such a way that they themselves are not abolished by it, but redeemed and fulfilled: It is with and through their own human culture, assumed and transfigured by Christ, that the multitude of God's children has access to the Father, in order to glorify him in the one Spirit" (CCC 1204).



Many think "catholic" means homogenous, that the Mass should be exactly the same everywhere. On the contrary, it is "catholic" because it takes in everything. It is, or at least it should be, a cross-cultural experience, for we all are the children of God. All cultures should find their expression in the Catholic Mass.

The difficulty is putting this into practice, especially in communities with members from more than one culture. Receptivity on the part of the pastor is important, too. As he learns about another culture, he'll be more open to using the best of it in worship. Perhaps you, along with other concerned parishioners, might discuss this with your pastor. There are resources and institutes available to assist you in making your worship truly reflect who you are individually and communally.
