#### From Father Schmeckel:

This Wednesday, February 22nd, is Ash Wednesday. This is the day that marks the beginning of the Season of Lent and our preparation for celebrating Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus. Ash Wednesday Masses are as follows:

6:45 AM - St John

12:10 PM – Blessed Trinity

5:15 PM - St John

6:30 PM – Blessed Trinity

The distribution of ashes will happen at all Masses. Please note: If you need to attend Mass during your lunch break, the 12:10 PM Mass will have no music and will move along more quickly. The homily at all Masses will be brief and concise to make sure Ash Wednesday Mass can be a part of your busy day.

As we begin this season of Lent, **what practices of Prayer**, **Fasting**, **and Almsgiving will you do** to grow in your love and knowledge of Jesus? I encourage you to spend some time this week thinking about some action or habit you could take up in each of those areas. Here are some ideas of the top of my head for each.

**Prayer:** Attend daily Mass; read the Gospel from daily Mass every day; turn off the radio in the car; pray a decade of the Rosary with your family; pray before and after your meals; find a good spiritual book to read; pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

**Fasting**: Get up when your alarm goes off without hitting the snooze button; read a book instead of watching television at night; talk less in some conversations; skip a meal during the week; drink tea instead of coffee.

**Almsgiving**: Spend extra time in the evening playing with your children; collect food or money for the food pantry or another charity; check your giving to your parish and other organizations; give your regular coffee money to a worthy cause; spend less on unnecessary purchases. The point of our Lenten practices are not to make us unhappy or to suffer, rather, using worldly and earthly things less reminds us that God is the giver of all good gifts. Let us grow in our love for Him during this Season of Lent!

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7-12: On Today's readings at Mass on this 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time are challenging and clear as Jesus tells us to "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." St. Paul also tells the Corinthians, and us, that "the temple of God, which you are, is holy." What does it mean to be holy? In Latin, holy is "sanctus" and it means to be "set apart" or "saint." In a recent Religious Education class, our students were told that as Catholics we are not better than anyone, but we should be different. Why is that? Because we know Jesus and are firmly convinced that He loves us and is with us and within us, so we have faith that no matter what, God is in charge and we trust



that He knows what is best! This belief and trust in God gives us freedom from fear and so we can be brave as we live HOLY lives in our desire to be a saint!! Abraham Lincoln, our 16th President, had a great quote that says "the only way to defeat an enemy, is to make them your friend." And this is precisely what Jesus is asking of us when He tells us to "love our enemies." I have told our Religious Education students several times that for me, the hardest word in the entire Bible is "as." We know that Jesus loves us and wants us to love Him in return, so He tells us not just "to love your neighbor, but to love him AS yourself"; to not just be perfect but to "be perfect AS your heavenly Father is perfect." In Greek, perfect means "telos" or "to see far" like in telescope. So what Jesus is telling us about being perfect, doesn't mean having perfect theology or our act totally together. No, what He means by this is to trust in God, to be in relationship with Him, because He sees the big picture and so He knows what He is doing in each of our lives to help us to be "set apart" and become a saint, so we can be with Him forever in paradise! 

Lenten Observance: The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason: a) Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday during Lent; b) Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Therefore, on these days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during these two days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

# Dear Padre,

I am wondering why Ash Wednesday is sometimes in February and sometimes in March. Who decides when Lent begins, and why is it always different?

The beginning of Lent is determined by the date of Easter, which is a movable feast, unlike Christmas, which is always on December 25. Easter falls on the first Sunday following the first full moon of spring. The first Sunday of Lent is six weeks before, and the Wednesday before the first Sunday of Lent is Ash Wednesday.

This subject has caused division in the Church since the second century, because the Eastern Church and the Western
