From Father Schmeckel:

This Sunday is the **First Sunday of Lent.** I admit that I sometimes dread the Season of Lent because extra prayer, fasting and almsgiving has its own difficulties, plus Lent is a time when Jesus often invites us into a deeper friendship with Him. Sometimes this even means taking up new practices or doing away with specific sins or vices but, no matter what we choose to do during this Lenten Season, let us ask Jesus to help us so that when Easter comes our love for Him has grown stronger and we have become more holy.

This week, I will lead a "Little Lent Retreat for Busy People" at each of our parishes. It will include silent adoration, a very short talk, the opportunity for Confession, and Benediction.

The topics are: Beauty, Peace, Joy. Having some quiet time for prayer might be a good way to start your Lent!

During Lent, especially in the A Cycle of readings this year, the Gospel for Mass is sometimes longer and more complex. I encourage you to try to read the Gospel ahead of time as part of your Lenten practices. That way when you come to Mass, it will be easier to follow along. Below are the Gospel readings for each Sunday:

First Sunday of Lent – Matthew 4:1-11 (Jesus is tempted in the desert)
Second Sunday of Lent – Matthew 17:1-9 (Transfiguration of Jesus)
Third Sunday of Lent – John 4:5-42 (Jesus & the Samaritan woman at the well)
Fourth Sunday of Lent – John 9:1-41 (Jesus & the man born blind)
Fifth Sunday of Lent – John 11:1-45 (the raising of Lazarus from the dead)
Palm Sunday – Matthew 26:14-27:66 (Passion & Death of Jesus)

At both of our parishes, you may have noticed an increasing number of people who prefer to kneel and to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. This is especially true at Saint John. I have also noticed that there are a number of people with mobility limitations that seem to feel a bit rushed when they receive our Lord in the Eucharist. I am considering a few ways to accommodate and help each person to receive Communion in his or her preferred way – in a reverent and accessible way. I want to give some heads up so that when it happens, no one thinks that I woke up one morning and decided to change something so significant.



Dear Padre,

In the Scripture passages about Jesus in the desert, it says he was alone. How do we know about things that happened to Jesus when he was alone?

In today's Gospel, we hear one passage about the temptation of Jesus in the desert. Matthew, Mark, and Luke all refer to this incident, but none indicates that anyone was with Jesus.

There were witnesses to many incidents in the life of Jesus. But sometimes the disciples of Jesus depended on his instruction. The first Christians heard about Jesus' instruction and life from the apostles. This preaching of the apostles occurred before Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John wrote anything down.

Over time, the evangelists gathered this preaching together and put it in written form. Gradually these writings

became accepted as the gospel, inspired by the Holy Spirit. The apostles were witnesses to what Jesus said and did, so Jesus did tell them things that others did not hear about until later.

Whatever Jesus experiences, he redeems. That means that while temptations are part of our life, they do not have to lead us away from God. Jesus shows us the way to meet them and overcome them.
