

From Father Schmeckel:

This Sunday, our Gospel is the story of Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well. The Gospel is a little longer and has many details. I encourage you to spend some time re-reading this Gospel and pre-reading next week's Gospel. Here are all the passages remaining in the season of Lent.

This Third Sunday of Lent – John 4:5-42 – Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well

Fourth Sunday of Lent – John 9:1-41 – Jesus and the man born blind Fifth Sunday of Lent – John 11:1-45 – The raising of Lazarus from the dead Palm Sunday – Matthew 26:14-27:66

A few more thoughts on the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the translation changes:

One of the reasons for the changes is to help renew our love, appreciation, and use of this Sacrament of Mercy and Conversion. Bishop Robert Barron often notes that in the 1970s and 1980s, the number of people regularly going to Reconciliation didn't just slowly drop off, but people completely stopped going. Re-emphasizing this Sacrament, renewing the examinations of conscience that are provided, and thinking of Reconciliation more frequently, can help us all to recognize how, where, and when we need God's grace and mercy to change and improve. Especially now, during this Season of Lent, I hope that you will take advantage of the opportunity to go to Confession and to grow closer to Jesus!

This Friday, March 17 is the **optional Memorial of Saint Patrick**. This year it happens to fall on a Friday. In the United States, the celebrations for Saint Patrick often include a meal of corned beef and cabbage – which conflicts with the usual refraining from eating meat on Fridays. However, because Saint Patrick captivates a large part of our imagination and emphasis as American Catholics, Archbishop Listecki has granted a dispensation from your obligation to go meatless this year. If you choose to go for the corned beef and cabbage, you could still choose to do some other penitential or spiritual offering. You could attend morning Mass, pray the Rosary or Divine Mercy chaplet, or pass on something else in your life on Friday.

If you've been to Mass at Blessed Trinity, you have noticed that the Crucifix and the images of the Saints have been covered with a purple cloth. The instructions for celebrating Mass give this as a practice that can be observed in our Catholic churches – often beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. As we make our way through Lent, we are called to be more focused on Jesus alone. Our practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are meant to "hone" our senses to look for and find Jesus in our prayer and in our daily lives. And so, we cover the images of the Cross and the Saints to help us focus more and more on our interior lives, our prayer, and our intimacy with Jesus, and to remember His suffering and death as we prepare for Holy Week





Dear Padre,

I have done some really terrible things in my life. When I did them, I didn't think anything about them, but now I feel very guilty. Can God really forgive me?

As we Redemptorists like to say, "With God there is plentiful redemption." God's mercy is everlasting and overflowing in its abundance. As we continue in Lent, let's remember that Easter is the sign that God forgave even the great sin of the crucifixion of his only Son. Time and time again throughout the Scriptures, Jesus demonstrates this bountiful mercy. He forgave Zacchaeus, the tax collector. He forgave the woman caught in adultery. He was tender with the Samaritan woman we hear about in today's



Gospel. He spent his days living among and forgiving all manner of sinners. He even forgave Peter's great denial. The Church has named a multitude of saints, but note that in 2,000 years it has never declared anyone to be definitively condemned to eternal punishment. There is hope and mercy for all.

No matter how great the sin, God will forgive it. All you have to do is ask for mercy sincerely. All that takes is a repentant heart. From the tone of your message, you are truly sorry. Find a priest with whom you are comfortable and ask him to celebrate with you the sacrament of reconciliation. If you don't know how to go to confession, just ask. The priest will help you. Be at peace.
