

From Father Schmeckel:

Again, I am providing of the recent Gospel readings for the Sunday Mass for you to read or re-read to deepen your understanding of them.

Third Sunday of Lent – John 4:5-42 – Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well

Fourth Sunday of Lent – John 9:1-14 – Jesus and the man born blind Fifth Sunday of Lent – John 11:1-45 – the raising of Lazarus from the dead

Palm Sunday – Matthew 26:14-27:66 – the Passion and Death of Jesus



This Sunday, we will read the account of the raising of Lazarus from the dead, which is one of my two yearly favorite Gospel readings. In this story, St. John tells us that when Jesus learned that his friend, Lazarus, died, "Jesus wept." Every time I read this, I am moved by how much Jesus loved Lazarus and cared for him, and was saddened by the death of his friend. In our translation, it says "Jesus became perturbed and deeply troubled." One author says that a better translation would be that Jesus "got worked up." From some class at St. Francis Seminary, I also remember being taught that it could also be translated, "Jesus groaned from the depths of his being." However it is technically translated, we should remember that our Lord is not just "bummed" about Lazarus' death, but saddened to the core of His humanity.

Those of us who hear and read this Gospel, should remember that God does not remain cold, indifferent, and distant from our pain and sorrows, rather He comes close to us, loves us and is willing to suffer alongside us with the Crosses that we carry throughout our lives.

Saturday, March 25th, was the **Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord.** This is the day, nine months before Christmas, when we remember and celebrate the time when the Angel Gabriel appeared and announced to Mary that she would conceive and bear the Child Jesus. Much like the Gospel this Sunday, the Annunciation reminds us that God comes close to us and that "God is with us." One way for us to remember the Annunciation in our daily lives is by praying the Angelus. Traditionally, this series of little prayers and Hail Mary's are said at 6:00 AM, Noon, and 6:00 PM. (If you're near a Church which rings bells throughout the day, you'll often hear them rung a little longer at these times). Even if you don't pray them at precise times, you could pray the Angelus in the morning, at lunch, and at dinner to remind you that Jesus is with you. Below is the prayer for your convenience.

- V/ The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary;
- R/ And she conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary...

- V/ Behold the handmaid of the Lord.
- R/ Be it done to me according to your word.

Hail Mary...

- V/ And the Word was made flesh.
- R/ And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary...

- V/ Pray for us, O holy Mother of God,
- Prince the end of the promises of Christ.

Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ your Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by his passion and cross be brought to the glory of his resurrection, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen

Dear Padre,

Are Catholic religious orders dying?

Yes...and no.

In Africa and Asia, some religious orders are vibrant, with orders of men and women religious increasing in number. In the United States, Europe, and Oceania, it's a different story. As many as 300 of the 420 institutes of women religious in the US are in their final decades of existence (Leadership Conference of Women Religious, 2019). One-third of all women's congregations in the US have fewer than fifty members. In the US, sisters over age ninety far outnumber those under sixty. Consequently, many communities fall



short of the number of active ministers needed to replace their elderly and retiring members. The story is similar for many orders of religious men.

As those in religious orders struggle to remain effective in their mission and ministry for God and humanity, they are reimagining styles of leadership, levels of administration, and, in short, ways of getting the job done. This includes, for example, creative partnerships with laypeople to share in the charism, community life, and ministry of the religious order.

People are still drawn to Jesus and the work of building the kingdom. Only God knows how this "building process" will look in the future. As in all challenging times, the Church remains hopeful. From crisis comes resurrection!
