From Father Schmeckel:

This Sunday our young people at Blessed Trinity Parish will receive their first Holy Communion! Please pray that this will be great moment as they grow in their friendship with Jesus!

Congratulations to the children of Saint John Evangelist Parish who received their First Holy Communion last Sunday!

This is a good opportunity for us to continue reflecting on what it means for each of us to receive our Lord in the Eucharist week after week. The

<u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u> provides a list of 'Fruits of Holy Communion'. This week I'll explain the first three and finish in next week next Sunday's bulletin.

Holy Communion, the Catechism says, (1) augments our union with Christ (no. 1391); (2) separates us from sin (no. 1393); and (3) wipes away venial sins (no. 1394). Here are a few comments about each of these.

First: Holy Communion augments our union with Christ. The Catechism quotes Jesus' own words: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." (Jn 6:56) Even when we think of it very practically, we can't get much closer to something than when we eat and digest it! Likewise, in a spiritual way, we cannot get much closer to Jesus than by eating his flesh and drinking his blood – which we do every time we receive the Consecrated Host at Holy Communion.

Second: **The Eucharist separates us from sin**. "The Body of Christ that we receive in Holy Communion is 'given up for us,' and the Blood we drink 'shed for the many for the forgiveness.'" (no. 1393) Jesus' sacrifice and death on the Cross – which we celebrate at every Mass – is for the forgiveness of our sins; therefore, if we receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist in a worthy manner, we become like oil, and sin becomes like water. – They just don't mix and go together.

Third: **The Eucharist wipes away venial sins**. In another article, we can discuss the difference between venial and mortal sins. For now, remember that receiving the Eucharist helps to wipe away our venial sins. Here's an analogy that might help. Eating well and staying well-hydrated when getting sick can sometimes help to avoid becoming more ill. The Eucharist acts in the same way. It nourishes and strengthens us so that we can fight off and work against any little sins that might lead us to more serious, more grave sins.

Last, an answer to a question I have received many times in the past few months: When should I stop kneeling after receiving Holy Communion? We kneel, in part, to show our smallness before God, to humble ourselves before God who created us, and to thank Him for feeding us in the Eucharist; so, once you're finished thanking God for being able to receive Him, you could sit down. (Kneeling isn't the only way that we can show love, reverence, and humility – so you shouldn't be embarrassed if you cannot kneel for any reason.) If you're looking for a clear signal for when it's "safe" to sit, I'll offer two options: 1) when the doors of the tabernacle are closed, or 2) when the Priest sits in his chair again. Hope that helps!

All of the priests of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee will be gathering this week from May 8-10 for the Spring Priest Assembly. Please pray for all of us as we gather for a time of formation, prayer, and fraternity!

Dear Padre,

I know a Catholic couple who wanted to celebrate their sacrament of matrimony at a Mass in a forest, but the bishop didn't allow it. Why not marry in God's creation?

A marriage between Catholics or between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic is usually celebrated in a parish church. It can be celebrated in another church or oratory with the bishop or pastor's permission. A marriage between a Catholic and an unbaptized person can be celebrated in a church or another suitable place, although a Catholic church remains the preferred place for the celebration.

Why is the parish church the preferred site for the celebration? For



Catholics, matrimony is a sacrament—one of the seven sacred signs through which God communicates love to us. When Catholics ask God to bind their union as a sacrament, the couple's love for each other is a sign of God's love for both, and their union is also a continuous sign of Christ's love for the Church. Thus, the church as a "house of God," which contains the presence of Christ, is revered as the most sacred place to make this most sacred commitment. Marriage, according to Pope Francis in a 2015 General Audience, "is not merely a ceremony in a church, with flowers, a dress, photographs....Christian marriage is a sacrament that takes place in the Church, and which also makes the Church, by giving rise to a new family community....[Saint] Paul says that the love between spouses is an image of the love between Christ and his Church. An unimaginable dignity!"
