

²From Father Schmeckel:

Today, fifty days after Easter, we are celebrating the Solemnity of Pentecost, the time that the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the Apostles, and they were inspired on fire and sent out on mission. As we pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit today, it is a good opportunity to pray about the gifts and the fruits of the Holy Spirit that we too have been given.

These seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, and fear of the Lord. We find the list of these gifts in the writings of the prophet Isaiah describing the working of the Holy Spirit.



The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes these gifts as "permanent dispositions which make man docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit." (no. 1830) These gifts that are given at Baptism and fulfilled on the day of our Confirmation help us to find God in our daily lives and respond to the ways He calls us or asks us to act or speak. Equally as important, these gifts of the Holy Spirit help us to respond to God spontaneously and with joy – rather than sluggishly and sorrowfully!

We can also think about the **twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit** on this great feast of Pentecost! These come from Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians. They are: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. In our spiritual lives, these could be a good measure of whether or not we're on the 'right' track. If anger and meanness is a regular description of you, perhaps there is something that needs to change in your life. If you are often anxious about things, you might pray to the Holy Spirit for more peace in your life and in your heart – and how God might be calling to you to become more peaceful. If you're struggling with gluttony or over-indulging in television or social media (or a lack of selfcontrol), perhaps the Holy Spirit is calling you to make a change!

In this week after Pentecost, let us take a moment to ask: **Do the fruits of the Holy Spirit describe** me and my life? How is the Holy Spirit moving me to receive the gifts and fruits that He offers us?

Next Sunday, Blessed Trinity Parish will celebrate our patronal feast day. On Sunday, June 4, Archbishop Jerome Listecki will be the principal celebrant of the 10:30 AM Mass. We are excited to welcome him to our community and to celebrate our feast day with us!

On the following Sunday, June 11, we will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (or the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus). After the 9:00 AM Mass at Saint John Evangelist Parish, we will have a short procession with the Blessed Sacrament. This will be an opportunity to bring Jesus out into the world in a prayerful and powerful way! Please plan to join us!

Dear Padre,

I am a practicing Catholic and I don't remember being confirmed. Is it too late for me to be confirmed?

The sacrament of confirmation usually happens when a person is older, and therefore you would likely remember the occasion. It could be that you were not confirmed. You can check with the parish you lived in during your school years to be sure. They keep records of confirmations done in the parish.

Confirmation is the final sacrament of initiation. Baptism ushers us into our life with God by giving us new life. Confirmation seals us with the spirit so we can follow Jesus and live out our

particular vocation. And the Eucharist gives us strength for the journey and keeps us in union with God.

If you discover you have not been confirmed or if you can't find out for certain, talk with your pastor. You would not be the first adult seeking confirmation. Your pastor can tell you how your diocese handles confirmation for adults. There might be a program of adult instruction for confirmation to ensure you understand the sacrament and the teachings of the Church.

Today is Pentecost, the day when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of the apostles. The Spirit gave them strength for what they had to do. The Spirit can do the same for you.
