

From Father Schmeckel:

This Sunday we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**. This is our Blessed Trinity Parish patronal feast day, and we are excited to welcome Archbishop Listecki as the Principal Celebrant for the Mass this Sunday!

The <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u> (no. 234) tells us:

"The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them." (no. 234)



In other words, the reality that God is one, but three persons is the basis for everything else that we believe as Christians. Even though the teaching on the Trinity can be complex and difficult to understand, it is good for us to spend time in prayer and study to reflect on who God is.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus speaks about His unity with His Father in heaven and with the Holy Spirit. Jesus shows us the face of God in a new and decisive way. Our Gospel for this Sunday shows us why He does this: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16)

On this Most Holy Trinity Day of Celebration, spend some time thinking about the many times God has stepped into your life and the lives of others and showed His love in a decisive and clear way!

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to **the Sacred Heart of Jesus**. While the secular world celebrates many other things during this month, we as Catholics celebrate the Heart of Jesus. Jesus loves us with a human heart, a heart that knows love in way that is similar to the way we know love. You might consider celebrating the Sacred Heart in some way with your family throughout this month. You could pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart with your family. You might also consider "enthroning" (displaying) an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus somewhere in your home and dedicating a little corner of your house to prayer.

MISSION CO-OP APPEAL (MCP) JUNE 10/11: This years' Mission Co-op Appeal is in support of the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Usambara, Tanga Tanzania, where, because of the extreme poverty, there is a great need for food. The Sisters will also be speaking during Mass about the other work that they are doing in that area and the needs that they have including:



- 1. Securing resources for the Formation of postulants and novices and ongoing formation of sisters and laity.
- 2. Securing modern medical equipment to help combat and treat diseases including malaria and HIV.
- 3. Constructing a new library, laboratory, and dormitory in two of their secondary schools
- 4. Making provisions for safe clean water in the rural areas for domestic use and livestock.
- 5. Offering education from kindergarten through high school especially for young women.

The Grandeur of God's Creation

June has arrived and we give thanks. This is the time of year when we can understand what the Jesuit priest and poet Gerard Manley Hopkins meant when he wrote, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God."

These Spring/Summer-like days give all of us the perfect opportunity to see the many extraordinary ways God reveals himself to us. We see the presence of God in the trees and flowers. We feel the presence of God



in the warmth of the sun and the gentleness of the breeze. We hear the presence of God in the singing of a bird and the babbling of a brook. Embracing God's grandeur...and sharing it is a gift that we can give to others, especially to the children whose lives we are privileged to touch. Here are some ways to do this:

Look for Signs of Life.

Be on the lookout for birds and rabbits, squirrels and chipmunks and dogs and cats, and parents walking babies in strollers. Consider and explain that all life comes from God, and that God cares for each one of us in the same way that parents care for their children.

Feel the Wind.

Take a walk on a windy day and think and talk about how we experience God in the same way that we feel the wind. We can't see the wind, and we can't see God, but we can feel the wind, and we can feel God's presence in our lives. God refreshes us in the same way a breeze cools us on a warm day. God urges us forward in the same way a strong wind pushes us along. God helps us to accomplish things in the same way that the wind carries a kite into the air.

Walk in the Rain.

This is a great time to think and talk about God's gift of rain! The puddles you splash through will eventually dry up, but the water doesn't disappear. It goes into the air in the form of vapor. When the air gets cold, the vapor forms clouds. When the clouds get too full of water, it rains. The rain creates puddles, and you're back to the miracle of the water cycle.

Laugh and Play.

Don't miss the opportunity to have fun on a glorious Spring/Summer Day. Whether you go to a park, to the beach or play in your own backyard, the chance to play will fill you with a sense of joy that reflects the way that God delights in all of His creation.

Spring and Summertime are truly God's special gifts to each and every one of us. They are gifts that are filled with God's grandeur. This is a great time to share His blessings with others. Enjoy and give thanks for these beautiful days!

Two relatives of mine died from a disease for which they never sought treatment. Both said, "God will heal me if that is his will." Wouldn't God have wanted them to see a doctor?

It is safe to say that God would have them see a doctor. Does doing so compromise our faith in God? No. Throughout all of salvation history, God has relied on human beings to be his instruments, his messengers. While we believe in God, who can and has acted miraculously throughout history, these moments are exceptions, not the rule. Ordinarily, God's work is done by

human hands. The spread of the gospel itself has come about through people who have responded to God in faith.

Part of this gospel story is the healing ministry of Jesus. Christianity has from the beginning taken up Jesus' ministry of healing and attempted to restore health to the sick, not only through prayer and the sacraments but also through institutions that care for the sick and the dying. Even as we recognize that our primary relationship is with God, we must also see that caring for our lives and our health, gifts from that same God, is a responsible way to receive and be good stewards of these gifts.

Think of the training, knowledge, and experience that doctors, nurses, and all other health-care practitioners have spent years attaining. Is not their work a miracle of God's love when it brings healing, restoration, and renewal?
