Jesus Has Compassion on the Crowds

From Father Schmeckel:

This Sunday is the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time. After all the feasts and celebrations of Easter and Pentecost and those related to them, we are now solidly in Ordinary Time. We read from Saint Matthew's Gospel almost completely until December. For the second reading, we will hear from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans – somewhat continuously for quite a few weeks. When we call this liturgical season "ordinary time", we do not mean that it is plain or boring. Instead, it comes from the word "ordinal", which means to count. We count the weeks of the year and organize our lives around God. One writer calls Ordinary Time "the time of conversion". This is a good attitude for us as we approach these weeks of summer – It is time for us to grow in holiness and love for Jesus!



On a personal note, this week will mark one year since I came to Saint John Evangelist and Blessed Trinity Parishes. I hope you won't mind if I use a portion of this week's bulletin to reflect on the past year and begin to look ahead.

First, I want to say: **Thank you to all of our dedicated staff and volunteers!** There are so many people who do so many different things and tasks to help keep our parishes focused on the Lord. I am grateful for all the ways – great and small – that you help us in the practical things in order for us to have a welcoming community that worships the Lord together.

Second, thanks for your patience and generosity with me as I learn how to be your priest! I know there are many missteps and errors I've made; slow communication and decisions; and plenty of other things that could have done better, but I also trust that Jesus is at work in our parishes in the midst of it all. He never fails to show up when we call on Him and ask Him to keep us on the right track.

I would also say **thank you for welcoming me to your families!** It amazes me that even in one short year, I have been involved in so many funerals, anointings, Baptisms, and First Communions! It is such a gift to me to be able to be with your families in all the highs and lows of life knowing, once again, that our good Lord is at work in all of it!

Looking ahead, I am sure many of the administrative parts of being your parish priest will become more natural. There are always new challenges and opportunities with maintaining our buildings and parish finances, working through personality conflicts and personnel concerns, communicating effectively and speedily, and a host of other things. These are all things that are slowly becoming more natural, and I'm learning bit by bit!

Another initiative that I would hope for us in the year ahead is to increase our opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration at both parishes – especially offering times for families and working people to be able to come to our church and pray. I believe these times for silent prayer and recollection before Jesus are a great opportunity for our personal growth in holiness and for evangelization. I hope that when the new school year begins in the fall, we will have a few new hours of adoration – and people to commit to an hour of prayer every week with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

The coming year will also give us a **lot of opportunities to pray and support vocations** to religious life, the diaconate, the priesthood, consecrated life, and holy matrimony. Already many good things are in the works that will be a great blessing to our parishes and to the Church!

Finally, let's remember to pray for one another and for our hearts to become more and more like the Heart of Jesus each day of this summer.



Dear Padre,

Is there a right to health care? As a Catholic, what kind of obligation do I have to use my resources to help with the purchase of medicine for my brother? His insurance won't cover the costs, and he's on a fixed income.

Saint John XXIII's 1963 encyclical Pacem In Terris (Peace on Earth) said people have a right to live and a right to the "means necessary for the proper development of life" (11). This text serves as a foundation for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' speaking of a right to "basic" or "adequate



health care" in their Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholics. What is not clear in Church teaching is who has the duty to ensure that right. In some cases, the state has taken this responsibility, but this need not be the case. The condition of millions of our brothers and sisters in Christ, however, urges us to action on their behalf.

Regarding the case of one's brother, the question is difficult because of the need for more information. What is the brother's prognosis? Is he taking care of himself responsibly? What do you feel capable of doing morally without placing yourself and others in your care at risk?

Whatever one's ability to respond in this case, one's relationship with one's brother should be marked by compassion and a sincere desire and will to help in whatever way is morally reasonable.
