

From Father Schmeckel:

During the upcoming week, we celebrate a number of saints and martyrs. Here's an introduction to a few of them.

June 27 – **Saint Cyril of Alexandria**. Saint Cyril was a bishop and doctor of the church who died in the year 444. He is known for his teachings against the heretic, Nestorius. Saint Cyril helped us to understand that Jesus is fully God and fully human. He helped to develop the language and articulation that we still use today to understand who Jesus is.



June 28 – **Saint Irenaeus**. Saint Irenaeus was a bishop and martyr who died around the year 202. One of his memorable lines is, "The glory of God is a human being fully alive." During my confirmation interview in high school, the priest gave me this quote. I had no idea who Saint Irenaeus was until many years later, but the line has always stuck with me. Sometimes we are tempted to think that a relationship with God will make us dull or boring. But Saint Irenaeus (who died as a martyr) firmly reminds us that life with Jesus makes us fully alive, and when we are truly human and alive, we can reflect on the glory of God wherever we go.

June 29 – **Saints Peter and Paul**. The prayers of the Mass for this Solemnity speak about these two great apostles as the foundation of the church – even though Peter and Paul each have very different gifts, temperaments, and missions. Peter was "foremost in confessing the faith", and Paul was an "outstanding preacher". Peter primarily taught and preached to the Jewish people of Israel, and Paul was the "master and teacher of the Gentiles" or the people from all the distant lands. In a particular way, today we pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis – as the successor of Saint Peter.

June 30 – **First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church**. This day commemorates the martyrdom of a small group of Christian martyrs who were brutally murdered by the Emperor Nero in the year 64. Many writers attribute many conversions to Christianity to the witness of these first Christians who remained faithful to Jesus even as they faced gruesome deaths.

If you're traveling during these summer months, be sure to make Sunday Mass a part of your planned activities. You can visit Masstimes.org to find local Mass times wherever you are going. You could even include a weekday Mass, that is often only about 30 minutes long. It is a good way to "add a little Jesus" to your vacation!

Please remember that next weekend we begin our new Saturday night Mass schedule rotation. Mass will be on Saturday, July 1 at 4:00 PM at Blessed Trinity Parish.

Dear Padre,

A friend of mine wants to be cremated. Does the Church permit it?

The Church permits cremation when extraordinary circumstances warrant it. There was never a direct canonical ban on cremation until 1886, simply because it was not widely practiced by the Christian Church; its members preferred inhumation—the traditional form of burial—in hopeful imitation of Christ, whose body was resurrected from the dead. The Church reacted to a proliferation of nineteenth-century cremation societies, primarily in Europe, with a decree that forbade Catholics from membership



in these societies or from cremation (with obvious exceptions made in times of public crisis, plagues, wars, etc.). The Church restated the ban as late as 1926 out of concern that these groups were anti-religious in promoting cremation as an argument against belief in the resurrection.

The Vatican has allowed cremation as an acceptable alternative to burial since 1963, except in cases where irreligious motives are apparent (Canon 1176, No. 3). Nevertheless, "although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites" (No. 413, Order of Christian Funerals, "Appendix 2, Cremation," 1997). Moreover, while the Church permits cremation, the scattering of ashes is forbidden. They are to be reserved with reverence in a sacred place.
