

2From Father Schmeckel:

In this week's bulletin I'm sharing a number of practical things for both of our parishes:

1. I will be away from our parishes from July 28 – August 8. I will be joining a group of young adults who are going to World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal. The World Youth Day was begun by Saint John Paul II in 1986, and has been held in Denver, Sydney, Toronto, Panama City, and other places during the past 37 years. It provides an opportunity for young people to pray, learn, and grow in their faith in union with the Pope. I am



very fortunate to be able to join in this year's celebrations. Three years from now, I hope that we can bring a group of our young people to wherever World Youth Day will be held so that they too can grow in their faith and also meet the Pope!

- 2. Thank you to all Saint John Evangelist parishioners who have made a pledge to support the Love One Another Campaign! I received word this week that we reached 100% of our goal! This is a great witness to the generosity of our parishioners. Even if you were unable to contribute financially, I am grateful for your prayerful support of this endeavor! Thank you!
- 3. This past week air conditioners were installed in the Religious Education wing at Saint John's. We were able to use "Faith in Our Future" funds that were set aside for facility improvements years ago. We can now use this space more comfortably throughout the summer and when Religious Education Classes begin again to provide opportunities for parishioners and others of all ages to learn together, to build community, and to grow in our friendship with Jesus.
- 4. You may have noticed at Blessed Trinity Parish that we have been restoring the confessional along the left side of the church. I am grateful to, and for, all those who have worked to make this possible. We now have a dedicated space that will be used solely for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I hope that having this designated area for the celebration of this Sacrament will help everyone make better use of this Sacrament of Mercy, and have Confession become a more regular part of all of our spiritual lives.
- 5. Our parishes have been designated as "teaching parishes" for a Seminarian from Saint Francis de Sales Seminary. Jacob Bruns will be with us on weekends and at other times for the next four years. He will serve in different roles as he continues his formation and preparation for the priesthood. Our parishes will be a great place for him to get involved in, and be connected to, parish life. This is a wonderful opportunity both for Jacob and for us. We will be involved in shaping the next generation of priests who will serve in our local churches. Look for an introduction from Jacob and more information about the role of our "teaching parishes" very soon. (Stay tuned for other updates about vocations in our parishes too!)
- 6. As we continue to be part of the Eucharistic Revival in the United States, we have a small group of parishioners from both parishes working on new opportunities for formation and Eucharistic Adoration. Beginning in the fall, we are hoping to offer Eucharistic Adoration on Thursdays from 6:00 AM 9:00 PM. We will be looking for people to commit to praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament for an hour each week! More details and opportunities to come!

Please know of my prayers for you while I am traveling together with Pope Francis and the hundreds of thousands of young people from around the world!

Preparing for the New Year - Religious Education 4K-Grade 6:

During these summer days, we are getting ready to begin the new school year and looking forward to helping families and most importantly, the children, learn about and celebrate the "Gift of Faith" that their parents gave them when they brought them to Church to be Baptized. Letters to parents, class schedules and information forms will be sent to all families whose children attended classes last year during the coming week.

Some additional information for families whose children will be NEW to our 4K-Grade 6 Program this year:

- 1. If your children will be attending our Wednesday afternoon classes (4:00 PM to 5:15 PM) for the first time this year, please contact us as soon as possible and let us know. We need to find Volunteer teachers/catechists, order materials, and prepare for all students, so having accurate enrollment numbers is very important.
- 2. Our 4- and 5-year-old Kindergarten classes fill quickly, as do some other classes, so please make sure you register your children for these classes as soon as possible.
- Preparation for two Sacraments, that children receive in the Spring of Grade 2, First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Eucharist (First Communion) begins in Grade 1, and First and Second Grade students should attend in-school classes to prepare for these Sacraments.
- 4. We also have an in-school program to prepare older children who have not received one or both of these Sacraments. Contact us as soon as possible if your older child needs special preparation for the Sacraments.
- 5. If you are aware of other families who are interested in enrolling their children in our program, please give me their names and contact information or have them get in touch with me.
- 6. If you or anyone you know is interested/willing to serve as teachers/catechists, substitutes, or teacher/program assistants from 4:00 PM to 5:15 PM on Wednesdays, please contact me as well.





Dear Padre,

Christians teach that Adam and Eve were the first man and woman and that they were created by God. How does the Catholic Church reconcile this belief with the theory of evolution?

Chapter 1 of Genesis contains the seven-day account of creation that we usually refer to when we reflect on the beginning of our world. The very next chapter contains a second account. The editors of the Bible were not distraught over the two differing



accounts; they left them side by side because they weren't interested in giving either a historical or scientific explanation for the world's origin. Rather, they were emphasizing deeper truths, such as the goodness of the earth as created by a loving and caring God. Scripture tells us that the Creator held human beings as especially precious.

Cannot these same values be maintained if we believe creation (or evolution) took longer than seven twenty-fourhour days? Perhaps God actually spent seventy billion years bringing forth the world's beauty. Details and numbers don't change the message of Genesis: God is good; God created the cosmos, heaven and earth, "all things visible and invisible," as we profess in the Nicene Creed, and all of creation is good. Furthermore, scientific discoveries surrounding space, matter, and all forms of life "invite us to even greater admiration for the greatness of the Creator, prompting us to give him thanks for all his works and for the understanding and wisdom he gives to scholars and researchers" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 283).
