From Father Schmeckel:

Thank you for all of your prayers while I was attending World Youth Day in Portugal.

This week, on Tuesday, August 15, we will celebrate **the Solemnity of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. **This is a Holy Day of Obligation**. Mass will be offered on:

Monday, August 14 - 5:15 PM at Blessed Trinity

Tuesday, August 15 - 6:45 AM at Saint John

Tuesday, August 15 - 6:30 PM at Blessed Trinity



On the Solemnity of the Assumption, we celebrate and remember that at the end of her earthly life Mary was taken up into heaven, body, and soul. Listening as the Priest prays the Preface of the Mass for this Solemnity will help us to understand the importance of this day. He will say:

"For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people...."

In other words, Mary's entrance into heaven shows us what we are all called to in the end. We are called to life in Heaven, and, after the Second Coming of the Lord, we also hope to share in the resurrection of our bodies. Mary's Assumption gives us "hope and comfort" because He has already done for her what He intends for each of us. When we encounter the Cross or suffering in our own lives, the Assumption also reminds us that the toils of this life are not the end of the story.

The Collect of the Mass today (the 'opening prayer') tells us a similar thing:

"Grant, we pray, that always attentive to the things that are above, we may merit to be sharers of her glory."

And so, amid all the things that we find in our daily lives - joys and sorrows, highs and lows, we look to heaven so that one day we can have the same reward and the same joy as Mary now enjoys in Heaven.

As mentioned, this celebration is a **holy day of obligation**. It might be helpful for us to remember what these holy days mean for us. Obviously, it includes attending Mass, but Canon Law also says:

"Moreover, [the faithful] are to abstain from those works and affairs which hinder the worship to be rendered to God, the joy proper to the Lord's day, or the suitable relaxation of mind and body." (c. 1247).

In a perfect world, this would mean that all of our offices, businesses, and schools would be closed for a day of rest, prayer, and joy, but, that is not the reality we live in. As such, our Lord gives us a clear invitation to be creative in finding ways to rest, to pray, and to be joyful. Skip doing the laundry, eat an extra helping of bacon and dessert, and pray the Rosary!

On a practical note, we are frequently in need of more ushers — especially for 4:00 pm Mass on Saturdays at Saint John. This could be an easy way for you or your family to be involved in the life of our parish in a new way. If you are interested in serving as an usher, please contact Gretchen in the Parish Office to sign up. Thank you to all of our ushers who do an incredible job helping people to feel welcome and comfortable when they come to Mass!





Dear Padre,

At what precise point in the Mass does the bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?

For many centuries, thinkers in the Western and Eastern Churches have pondered this question. Some say the moment of consecration happens at the beginning of the sentence, "This is my body." Others say it happens at the conclusion of that sentence. Still others claim it happens sometime during the sentence. The same theories were proposed about the consecration of the cup. From the Eastern Churches, the theory



was raised that it wasn't the eucharistic narrative that was consecratory, but rather the prayer of invocation to the Holy Spirit known as the *epiclesis*.

These theories continue to be debated, but to what avail? Even the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* does not specify when the consecration happens (*CCC* 1375–81). But knowing the precise moment it happens doesn't seem to be as important as simply knowing that the elements of bread and wine over which the prayer is prayed do become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.

This mystery of faith, moreover, adds another dimension to our lives: transformation into Christ. Whether we share in Communion at the liturgy or contemplate the Lord in the tabernacle, the loving call of the Spirit is to change our hearts. Specifically, when does that happen to us? One never knows for sure. But by participation in the mystery of faith, we're changed ever more deeply into the One whose Body and Blood we share. •
