

#### From Father Schmeckel:

For spiritual reading, I have been re-reading Archbishop Fulton Sheen's "The Priest is Not His Own", all about the spirituality and living out of priestly life. As usual, Archbishop Sheen is sharp, insightful, and quite witty at times. One insight in particular struck a chord with me. He wrote:

"Do we organize for soul-saving with the same zeal as we organize for fund drives? When money is needed, a priest thinks nothing of organizing a door-to-door canvass; but how often does he make a door-to-door canvass for converts? Are we having our parish continually repoyed by souls who come to tall them what Cod has do

continually renewed by souls who come to tell them what God has done for them?"

Obviously, Archbishop Sheen is writing in a different time. Door-to-door fundraising for parish needs isn't done in quite the same way that priests might have done in his time, but we are still very attentive to making sure we raise the right amount of money to do various things. Now that both of our parishes have successfully participated in the Love One Another Capital Campaign, I can't help but think that Archbishop Sheen's words can and should be an invitation for our parishes.

How can we go door-to-door in our communities and make sure that each household knows about Jesus and about our parish? How can we make sure that every family in our communities has their basic needs met? How can we go from family-to-family making sure that we are inviting people to our parishes and into a friendship with Christ?

I certainly don't know all the ways to accomplish this, but I do know that these are good questions for us to pray and think about as we live and work together as a parish and as a community!

On a practical note, we are frequently in need of more ushers — especially for 4:00 pm Mass on Saturdays at Saint John. This could be an easy way for you or your family to be involved in the life of our parish in a new way. If you are interested in serving as an usher, please contact Gretchen in the Parish Office to sign up. Thank you to all of our ushers who do an incredible job helping people to feel welcome and comfortable when they come to Mass!

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION GRADES 7-12 UPDATE:** As we draw nearer to the end of summer, we look forward to the beginning of another year of Religious Education classes here at St. John Evangelist. Our theme for this year's 7-12th grade classes is prayer. The best definition of prayer that I have ever heard is from Dr. Ralph Martin who said that prayer is to "pay attention." Truly, to pray means literally "to ask." In today's gospel story, we see the persistence of the Canaanite woman asking Jesus to cure her sick daughter. Many people believe Jesus was rude when he tells her that "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel" or "it is not right



to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." But in Greek, the word for dogs that Jesus uses is "kynariois" meaning "a little dog, as in a puppy." So, there is no intentional scorn given to the woman, but rather Jesus uses a term of endearment, recognizing her deep faith and devoted love for her daughter. Perhaps Jesus was actually testing her to see if she really and truly trusted that He could heal her daughter and drive out the demon. Do we possess that great faith? Do we persist in prayer? Do we believe that God can and does work miracles or do we limit Him? This is where prayer is vital, for without a regular prayer life, our faith weakens and our relationship with God withers. Just like in any of our human relationships, communication is key to being friends. I like to say that another way to spell "love" is "time." For we make time for what is important. So as we begin another year of faith formation, please pray for all of our students and their families; our dedicated catechists and their families and for all of SJE to deepen our prayer lives by "paying attention" to the constant presence and love of God in our lives and in each of us! 





## Dear Padre,

Why are the Scripture readings for Mass so piecemeal? We read part of a verse then jump to another part. Doesn't reading it like this distort the meaning of the passage?

The readings for Mass are in a book called the *Lectionary*. Our current *Lectionary* was set up after the Second Vatican Council. It uses a three-year cycle for the Sunday readings, so over three years we hear the majority of the Bible at Mass. Its introduction states, "The present Order of Readings for Mass, then, is an arrangement of biblical readings that provides the faithful with a knowledge of the whole of God's word, in a pattern suited to the purpose" (General Introduction to the Lectionary, Second Edition, 60).

So the readings are not "piecemeal" but rather arranged so that we are exposed to the whole of God's word within three years. At times a given reading may not be complete—for example, the second reading for today is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans, chapter eleven, verses 13–15 and 29–32. This is



done not only for brevity but for clarity. Those who organized the Lectionary thought that this excerpt made the message clearer or gave better emphasis to a point in the reading. It certainly is good to get out your Bible and read the whole section so you can see what is missing, but when the word is proclaimed at Mass, the current arrangement is most effective.
