

From Father Schmeckel:

You have probably already noticed that there is one point in the Mass when parishioners from Blessed Trinity Parish tend to stand at a different time than parishioners from St. John Evangelist Parish. Then visitors stand at a completely different time. The result is a rather humorous wave of people uncertainly standing at very different moments. That part of the Mass is called **the Offertory**. After all of the readings, the Creed, and the Prayers of the Faithful, this is the offertory. Usually, music is sung, the collection is taken for the mission and maintenance of our parishes, and the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward as the altar is prepared. After everything has



been prepared, the priest prays several prayers that are said quietly; he incenses the offerings, cross, and altar; and he washes his hands.

After all of this, the priest faces the people and prays out loud:

"Pray, brethren (or, brothers and sisters),
that my sacrifice and yours
may be acceptable to God,
the almighty Father."

The instructions for Mass say this: "**The people rise and reply**."

"May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands
for the praise and glory of his name,
for our good
and the good of all his holy Church."

The "most correct" moment to stand is between the Priest's prayer and the people's response., however, getting the timing perfect shouldn't be our primary goal. At this part of the Mass, it is most important for us to focus on offering our lives to Jesus who will soon be made present on the altar of sacrifice.

While I am already giving feedback on habits at Mass, I'll offer one more suggestion. If you choose to put your kneeler up or down at some point during the Mass, try to do so quietly and with some control. This will help all of us to pray and maintain a spirit of recollection at transition points during Mass.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Saint Peter's great profession of faith in Jesus the Christ, the Son of the living God. In part of his response, Jesus says to him, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (For the whole story, read Matthew 16:13-20.) This is where the Church receives the authority of the forgiveness of sins through the Sacrament of Penance (or Reconciliation or Confession). As the summer begins to wind down and many families are preparing for a new school year, setting aside time to make a good confession is a good way to prepare for the fall and all the opportunities the Lord will offer us.



Dear Padre,

Why do Catholics believe they are the only true Church?

Roman Catholics believe our Church has historical continuity with St. Peter and the apostles who were present on the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit gave birth to the Church. Catholics believe the work begun by Peter and the other apostles continued under men they appointed and on whom they laid hands—giving them apostolic authority to carry their work into the next generation. Apostolic authority, understood by Catholics to be historical and traceable, is a mark of authenticity and continuity of the Church. For Catholics, this essential mark of the Church is missing if a Christian community rejects apostolic authority and Peter's leadership of the other apostles—carried on by their successors in the persons of bishops and popes—over the last 2,000 years.



Nevertheless, "numerous elements of sanctification and truth" are present in separated Churches and ecclesial communities, and "the Spirit of Christ has not refrained from using them as instruments of salvation" (Responses to Some Questions Regarding Certain Aspects of the Doctrine on the Church, by the Vatican Offices of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, 2007).

Dialogue with other Christians continues, and we hope the love and respect we have for one another can grow over time. While our Church leaders have the role of conserving the faith we have received, all Christians should remember that the Law of Love must prevail. If we violate that principle, we fail to comprehend an essential truth of our faith.
