

From Father Schmeckel:

About prayer and Eucharistic adoration, Pope Francis recently said this:

"How do I pray? Only in adoration, only in the presence of the Lord, do we truly rediscover our taste and passion for evangelization. Oddly enough, we have lost the prayer of adoration; and everyone, priests, bishops, consecrated men and women, need to recover it, this ability to be quiet in the Lord's presence. Mother Theresa, busy about so many things in life, never neglected adoration, even at times when her faith was shaken and she wondered if it was all true or not."



As you have already heard me say, we are beginning Eucharistic adoration on Thursdays from 6:00 AM until 9:00 PM, starting on October 5 at Saint John (as an effort of both parishes). We are still looking for people who are willing to commit to a weekly hour of prayer before the Lord in the Church – especially during the afternoon. Please take a moment to look at the sign up in the back of both churches and consider taking one of the 'shifts' of prayer.

And to continue my recent articles regarding the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**, this week we will focus on how the Sacrament is celebrated.

The ritual book for the Anointing of the Sick gives priests a lot of flexibility and options for how to celebrate this sacrament. There are three distinct and integral aspects of this sacrament: 1) the prayer of faith, 2) the laying on of hands, and 3) the anointing with oil.

The "prayer of faith" usually includes some penitential act (Confession is recommended when possible) – recognizing that the sick person and all of us are sinners; a short reading from Sacred Scripture; and prayers asking God to heal and be with the sick person.

The "laying on of hands" is another important part of the ritual. The priest is supposed to silently place his hands on the head of the sick person and pray for them. This gesture repeats and echoes what Jesus Himself often did when healing people throughout the Gospels and also what the Apostles did in their own ministry of healing and reconciliation.

The "anointing with oil" is really the 'heart' of the Sacrament. The priest uses the Oil of the Sick. This is olive oil that is usually blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week. First, the priest anoints the sick person's forehead saying,

"Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit."

. Then he anoints the person's hands, saying:

"May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

These three parts are the essentials of the celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. A priest does have some flexibility and options (though *not* with the words in bold above). Most priests will try to adapt the celebration depending on the wellness of the person, the number of people participating in the prayer, and other individual circumstances.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE GRADES 7 - 12:

Today we hear in Matthew's Gospel (18:21-35), the parable of the unforgiving servant. This can basically be summed up in the one sentence from the Our Father prayer taught to us by Jesus himself when He said, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." (Mt. 6:12) In other words, to expect to be forgiven, we need to forgive....as simple and sometimes as hard as that! The amazing grace though is that God is ALWAYS ready, willing and able to forgive us. We just need the honesty, humility and courage to ask for it. How blessed we are as



Catholics to have the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where we can go to God Himself, acting in his vicar, the priest, and be forgiven and absolved of ALL of our sins!! Please avail yourself of this encounter with Jesus by going to Confession sometime soon. Make time for it-you will not be disappointed. Speaking of making time, during this new RE year and this time of Eucharistic Revival, let us all strive to center our lives and our families around getting to Mass each week and receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. Yes, life is busy, but we make time for what is important and what is more important than our relationship with God? Certainly not sports, the Packers, screentime or other agenda items. Our patron saint, St. John Evangelist wrote in his first letter that "God is love." (1Jn4:8) And what is this love? It sacrifices and creates. I challenge all of us to put God first, to center your life, your families, your week around God and not to just plug Him in when convenient. By putting Jesus first, you will find the peace, mercy, freedom and JOY that you long for. Let's try this by getting our kids to Religious Education on Wednesdays and then to Mass on the weekend. To pray before meals and before bed. St. Pope John Paul II used to tell his Swiss guards that "I cannot want for you." Your decision to make an intentional choice for God each day just may have a huge evangelizing impact on your kids and others to be faithful and courageous. After all, God is well pleased by our desire to please Him and He is a God that created everything out of nothing, so He can create time too. Give it a try. See you at Mass!



Dear Padre,

Why are churches doing away with the confessionals?

In many churches, when it is feasible, the traditional confessional box is modified or even replaced by a more spacious, less darkened reconciliation room. In 1974, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops decreed that "small chapels or rooms of reconciliation be provided in which penitents might choose to confess their sins through an informal face-to-face exchange with the priest, with the opportunity for appropriate spiritual counsel." Later, a further elaboration recommended austere furnishings and decoration in this space, "with nothing superfluous in evidence beyond a simple cross, table



and Bible. The purpose of this room is primarily for the celebration of the reconciliation liturgy; it is not a lounge, counseling room, etc. The word 'chapel' more appropriately describes this space." If a reconciliation chapel does not provide a fixed screen or grille between the penitent and confessor, it must be offered elsewhere, according to canon law. "The purpose of this norm is...to afford the penitent anonymity if he or she desires and to make certain that there is no suspicion of impropriety in the confessor-penitent relationship" (Code of Canon Law, 964 commentary).

Ideally, the environment of the reconciliation chapel helps the penitent and confessor feel they are "on holy ground" (Exodus 3:5) in encountering God in this sacrament. It offers an inviting sacred space to celebrate a powerful expression of God's mercy and unconditional love.
